1879	13 October	Oxford, OXF	at the Assizes	<p><i>Louisa Barnard</i>, 28, hawker (imp), was indicted for the manslaughter of Ellen Barnard, at Wantage, on the 14th of August.</p> <p>Prisoner pleaded not guilty. Mr. Mowbray prosecuted, and Mr. Baker Smith defended. Elizabeth Barnard, widow of Wantage, stated that the child was born on Christmas Day. She frequently saw it, and it appeared to be healthy. She saw the child when it died, and went and told the mother, who was in the Bird in-hand [<i>sic</i>] public house, and she went home at once.</p> <p>Cross-examined : She had known the prisoner 12 years, and she was a hard working, industrious woman. She saw the child almost daily, but never saw the woman use it badly. The mother used a fish basket for a cradle. The child was healthy but small. Witness saw one of the clergy go to the house of the prisoner. She did not notice that the child was covered with a shawl when she saw it in a fish basket. She did not know that the prisoner went to the public house to sell fish. She never heard the prisoner say her husband gave her no money.</p> <p>Matilda Rose, wife of Christopher Rose, of Wantage, deposed that she was related to the prisoner, whom she assisted at the time of the birth of the child, which was fat but small. It went on very well for a few weeks, but did not seem very healthy. The child appeared to her to be dirty at times. The last time she saw the child was in the house where it was left alone for two hours. The child was then ill. She went and called P.C. Alder.</p> <p>Cross-examined ; She had heard the prisoner complain that her husband gave her no money. Her house was very badly furnished. The husband was sleeping at home just before the child died. The prisoner went to the public house to sell her fish.</p> <p>Mary Ann Stimpson saw the child after it was born and it was a "sic-baby." She saw it at different times, and it was in a filthy condition. The prisoner was in the habit of attending public houses, and was often intoxicated. Witness had cleaned the child, and looked after it, because prisoner left it with her. She saw the prisoner with the child in her arms at half-past twelve on the day it died, and it was then very filthy, and thin. At five o'clock she saw it dead. She had heard the prisoner's husband frequently complain of the way she kept the child.</p> <p>Cross-examined : The husband never called in a medical man, and witness never saw him give her money to support herself and her babe. She had told witness she had no money. She never saw the child ill-treated. Prisoner sometimes paid her for looking after the child. The husband was away from home on one occasion for five or six weeks.</p> <p>Ann Lovegrove stated that she knew the prisoner from March till 10th of June, and she never saw her give the child food, or suckle it. On one occasion she saw the prisoner tear a piece off the child's napkin, make a sugar-teat with it, and put it in the child's mouth. She told her she was killing the child by inches, and she said she was bringing it up "hardy."</p> <p>Cross-examined : Sugar was very nourishing, but not through a piece of rag - (laughter). The prisoner was obliged to go out to work, and the child was generally laid on a shawl.</p> <p>Mr. Barker, surgeon of Wantage, made a post-mortem examination of the body of the child on the 15h of August. It was very much emaciated, and entirely destitute of fat, without any nourishment or remains of nourishment in the stomach. There was no trace of organic disease in the child. The cause of death was inanities or starvation. He saw the child on the 4th of August, and it was then getting thin. The prisoner was perfectly able to suckle it. There was no doubt that it had not been properly suckled.</p> <p>Cross-examined : He made the post mortem examination by request of the coroner. He considered it was necessary to say at the coroner's inquest that the mother exhibited an utter indifference when he made the post mortem examination. She was present, as it was made in her own house, and he had no power to turn her out.</p> <p>Will you swear that it was not mute grief, or a stupor of intense sorrow? - I am not poetical - (laughter).</p> <p>Mr. Baker Smith, in defence, could not see why the prisoner was charged, as it was shown in evidence that her husband was at home some time before the child died, and all the witnesses had said that they had never seen her ill-treat it.</p> <p>His Lordship, in summing up the evidence, pointed out to the jury that what they had to decide was whether the child died from the neglect of the prisoner in doing what she was bound to do. Although there was evidence that the child was in a filthy condition, there was none that it had been regularly suckled, as stated by the counsel for the defence. A very important consideration in such cases as these was what the neighbours felt while the child was still alive, and it was in evidence that one of the witnesses told the prisoner that she was killing it by inches.</p> <p>The Foreman asked Mr. Barker if the prisoner was able to suckle the child? Mr. Barker said that on the 4th of August she appeared in good condition. The jury found the prisoner guilty, but strongly recommended her to mercy. His Lordship entirely agreed with the verdict, and sentenced the prisoner to one year's hard labour.</p>	<i>The Abingdon and Reading Herald</i> , 1 November 1879, 6
