The party consisted of three men, five women, and thirteen children, the whole of whom travelled in a covered cart or caravan. They gave their names as Peter Hicks, of Brampton, near Newbury, Berkshire, rat-catcher and horse-dealer, Wm. Belcher, of Bristol, rat-catcher, Thomas Stanley, of Winterbourn, Wiltshire, Rebecca Belcher, Roda Stanley, Betsey Hicks, Betsey Stanley, and Cecilia Belcher.
