He searched his tent and found the potatoes now produced. James Bland, sen, and John Bland pleaded not guilty, the others pleading guilty. Mr. Geare prosecuted. Mr. James Robin Holmes, shopkeeper, East Hanney, proved securing his shop on the night of January 18th. When he got up in the morning he found the house had been broken into, and that articles to the value of 4l. 12s. were missing. D.S. Foster said he visited the house where the prisoners lived, in company with P.C. Smith. He searched the house, and found the timepiece and articles of clothing produced, which had been identified as the property of the prosecutor. Witness found a dark lantern in the house. P.C. Smith said that he made a search of the garden adjoining the house where the prisoners lived, and found the butter-knife produced belonging to the prosecutor. Supt. Dorvell said he examined prosecutor's premises. It did not occur to him that there were more than three persons engaged in the burglary. The Judge, in summing up, said that, if they did not think proper to convict the prisoners of burglary, they could find them guilty of receiving the goods. He pointed out that the evidence was very meagre against the prisoners. After a short deliberation the Jury acquitted both the prisoners. The men who had pleaded guilty were then brought up for judgment. His Lordship said James Bland, jun, and Austin had previously been convicted, but nothing was known against Davis before. Bland and Austin would be committed for 12 months [sic] imprisonment with hard labour, and Davis for six months' hard labour.	<i>The Abingdon Herald</i> , 30 April 1887, 6

Gannale-Maitland, Esq. - P.C. Pitson deposed that on Sunday last, about half-past 3 p.m., he was on duty in plain clothes, and saw the defendants in a gap in the hedge about 10 yards from the apple trees. When they saw him, they ran across another field. He went to the gap in the hedge where he first saw them, and found the apples (produced). He captured the boy, who told him their names, and also said that the girls took the apples. When he caught the boy he was about 100 yards off the apples. - The girls denied having been in the orchard, and said that P.C. Pitson threatened the boy a "hiding" if he did not own to stealing them. The boy said he only went to get a few blackberries, and never touched any apples. - Witness, in reply to questions by Major Keene: He first saw them about 10 yards off the orchard in a gap in the hedge. When they saw him they drew back behind the hedge, and ran away. He first saw them from the top of the hill. He went and searched them all, but found no apples on them.
