WILLIAM BLEWETT was indicted for stealing, on the 18th of June last, one mare, price 4 l. the property of John Redford .</p> <p>JOHN REDFORD sworn.</p> <p>I am a farmer : on Friday the 17th, or the morning of the 18th of June, I lost a mare, in the night, from a field near the nine-mile stone, near Southall ; I had seen her between seven and eight o'clock on Friday evening; I saw her again at Norwood, about fourteen miles from my field, on Wednesday the 22d, about two o'clock, in a miller's yard; she was brought home by a postman that night; the prisoner was a stranger.</p> <p>JOHN BALDWIN sworn.</p> <p>I am a servant to a farmer; I work for Mr. Stone, Pinner's-park; I bought this mare on the 19th, about nine o'clock in the morning, on a Sunday, at Norwood, going along the road, of William Blewett , a gipsey; I gave four guineas for her to the gipsey; he told me he had swapped her with a man at Marlow, and there was no danger of its being stolen; John Redford came on the Wednesday following, and took her away: I kept the mare at some little meadows, with an acquaintance, where I lodged, his name is Scott, he is here present; a miller took the mare away, and they sent for me, and I met them at Pinner, and the mare was in Pinner-park; I worked at Pinner; I left the mare at the meadows in the morning, at Norwood; Mr. Redford owned her as his mare, and I gave it up to him, and he sent the mare home by the postman; I and Redford went after the prisoner, and found him under a hedge, between Radcliff and Ulstree; he laid down; and I went up to him, and told him a man had owned the mare, and he must go with us; Mr. Armstrong was with me; he said he would with all his heart; he said he would give an account where he swapped another for it; I had him up to Ulstree, and from thence to the justice's, and he was committed.</p> <p>(Mr. Redford describes the mare: a blaze in her face, one white foot behind, about fourteen hands high, a bay blind mare; she was six years old, worth about four or five pounds; she had a broken knee, a sort of a nag-tail, crossed leg behind.)</p> <p>Court to Baldwin. What was this miller? - He was a man that took the mare out of the meadow for the sake of the guinea reward.</p> <p>- ARMSTRONG sworn.</p> <p>I am a baker: I met this man with the mare on Saturday morning the 18th of June, between seven and eight, and he offered me this mare to sell for six guineas and a half; it was about four miles from where she was stolen; I looked at the mare, and I saw she was blind; he said she was not, she had only got a ball eye; I told him I thought he did not come by her honestly, and he pulled out a paper out of his pocket, that he had swapped a horse for this mare, on the 1st of May, at the Crown, at Great-Marlow; he asked me when I should be home; I told him I should not be home before eight o'clock; and I told him I had a mare, and I would make a rap with him; I am sure the mare he had is the prosecutor's mare; I saw the miller give him the mare: when he brought the</p> | Proceedings of the Old Bailey, t17910720-38 |

The evidence tended to show that the deceased lived very unhappily with her husband, who was continually quarrelling with her, and that the last quarrel took place between them on Thursday, the 3rd inst. Mary Davis, wife of Reuben Davis, miner, deposed, that on Thursday afternoon, the 3rd inst., she heard a cry of murder proceed from the house of Mrs. Doyle, where the deceased and her husband lodged. She went to the door, which was open, and saw the deceased in a crouching position, in the coal-hole. Her mouth was bleeding, and her husband was standing over her with a kettle in one hand, and holding her by the other. The deceased begged of her husband not to throw the water over her three times, and held the handle of the kettle with her left hand. Deceased was trying to push it from her, and her husband was trying to throw the water over her, which eventually went over her neck and shoulders. - James Fisher, Esq., surgeon, said the deceased was brought to him deeply scalded over the lower parts of the face, the whole of the front of the neck and chest as far as the waist. She was also scalded from the shoulders to the lower part of the back. Witness applied suitable applications to the scalds, and also supplied her with clean and dry clothes. He visited her again the same evening, at the house of Mrs. Doyle, and attended her till the Wednesday following, the 9th, on which day she was removed to the Poorhouse, where witness subsequently attended her until Sunday, the 13th, when she died. The prisoner was taken into custody on Wednesday night. - Cross-examined : The reason of the feasting and dancing, it was May-day time, and the servant boys and girls had a week's holiday. Harrison, Esq., charged with having committed a murderous assault upon Martha Brewett [sic]. The prisoner, it is stated, belongs to a tribe of gipsies, and he has obtained a livelihood by travelling the country with a grinding-wheel. The woman upon whom the murderous assault was committed has lived with him as his wife, and she has borne him seven children. Occasionally she has accompanied him in his rounds, leaving the elder children at home in Bailey lane. Both the prisoner and his paramour were addicted to drinking, and the fact of their being together at home was always known in the neighbourhood by the disturbances which they created. On Monday night they were drinking together, and noises as of persons quarrelling came frequently from their home during the night. About six o'clock on Tuesday morning the prisoner was seen to drag the woman out of the house, and having thrown her down he commenced kicking and striking her over the head in the most brutal manner. Her cries were heard by Police-officer Hornsey, who was on duty in a street near, and on hastening to the place he found the woman lying on the pavement insensible, and blood flowing from her head in a stream. He secured the prisoner, and then had the woman carried into her house, and medical assistance sent for. It was found that she had received several fearful wounds over the head, and throughout Tuesday she was lying in a very dangerous state.
