1847	June	Dudley, STS	inquest on the body	On Thursday by adjournment from Monday, an inquest was held in Dudley, on the body of a married woman, named Mary Ann Blewitt, when after a patient investigation of the details of the case, the Jury returned a verdict of "Wilful Murder" against Harkless Lovell Blewitt, the husband of the deceased. The evidence tended to show that the deceased lived very unhappily with her husband, who was continually quarrelling with her, and that the last quarrel took place between them on Thursday, the 3rd inst. Mary Davis, wife of Reuben Davis, miner, deposed, that on Thursday afternoon, the 3rd inst., she heard a cry of murder proceed from the house of Mrs. Doyle, where the deceased and her husband lodged. She went to the door, which was open, and saw the deceased in a crouching position, in the coal-hole. Her mouth was bleeding, and her husband was standing over her with a kettle in one hand, and holding her by the other. The deceased begged of her husband not to throw the water over her three times, and held the handle of the kettle with her left hand. Deceased was trying to push it from her, and her husband was trying to throw the water over her, which eventually went over her neck and shoulders James Fisher, Esq., surgeon, said the deceased was brought to him deeply scalded over the lower parts of the face, the whole of the front of the neck and chest as far as the waist. She was also scalded from the shoulders to the lower part of the back. Witness applied suitable applications to the scalds, and also supplied her with clean and dry clothes. He visited her again the same evening, at the house of Mrs. Doyle, and attended her till the Wednesday following, the 9th, on which day she was removed to the Poorhouse, where witness subsequently attended her until Sunday, the 13th, when she died. On Tuesday, witness made a <i>post mortem</i> examination, and was of opinion, from what he observed, that the immediate cause of death was the scalds she received during life. 



He secured the prisoner, and then had the woman carried into her house, and medical assistance sent for. It was found that she had received several fearful wounds over the head, and throughout Tuesday she was lying in a very dangerous state. A medical certificate testifying to the state of the poor woman was in was produced, and at the request of the Chief Constable the prisoner was remanded.
