1839	15 January	Hagbourne, BRK	buried	aged 85, West Hagbourne common It is often remarked that a dead donkey or a dead gipsy is seldom seen ; but on Tuesday last, the most rare spectacle of a gipsy's funeral was witnessed at East Hagbourne, as they are generally supposed to be buried under a hedge, or in a barrow, or wood. Some little time since, Lewis Boswell, son of the late Gipsy King Solomon, came within the parish of Hagbourne, then very ill, and no doubt with the intention of being buried by the side of his father. He was visited frequently in his tent, by the vicar, the Rev. R. Meredith, and died on Friday, the 10th instant. He was followed to the grave by his widow and descendants, and some of the tribes of Buckland's and Smith's [sic]. The beauty of the women, and the black piercing eyes of the men were remarkable. Their swarthy countenances and raven hair, (some of which would have been improved by washing and combing,) also contrasted strangely with the flaxen hair of the numerous bystanders. His dog was also a follower. The service was impressively performed by the vicar, amidst the wailing of some of the women, and it was very pleasing to see how fervently some of them joined in the Lord's prayer, and other portions of the service. At the conclusion, Mr. Meredith delivered a short address, imploring them to prepare themselves for another world, as we must all soon be like that man, laid in the grave, and taken from this world for ever. It was expected that they would perform on the violin over his grave, the same as when his father, Solomon, the King, was buried ; but here the bystanders were disappointed, for each one in their turn took some hand-fuls [sic] of earth and threw it on the coffin, evidently considering this to be a sacred duty, and apparently connected with some superstition belonging to this peculiar people. His <i>Gypfean Majefty</i> attended the ceremony : Charlotte Bofwell was bride-maid, and 10 or 12 of the gang likewise attended. They presented the Clergyman who performed the ceremony with 10s. 6d. and to the ringers 15s. with a good dinner and drink in great plenty. - We underftand that a marriage ceremony amongft this tribe of people is always celebrated with great merriment, and the feafting lasts for 14 days ; indeed it is imposible to conceive a happier set of people than they appeared to be on this occafion. The confummation of the nuptial rights was intended to be in Humbertone-field ; where perhaps Phœnix and his <i>tawny</i> Princefs, upon a green fod, with the canopy of heaven their only covering, may tafte as much real felicity as those of a higher order in their beds of down with <i>pillows of thorns</i> ... Phoenix's trade is that of a tinker - his wife is a dealer in <i>palmeftry</i> ... The Gypfies have undoubtedly a form of government amongft themselves, and to their King pay the most implicit obedience ; to this fubmiffion we may fairly attribute their apparent happiness ; - they have no falfe honour amongft them, and they look upon fame as the moft grievous punishment in the world. - ...Phoenix' trade is that of a tinker — his wife is a dealer in palmistry... We learn that in a few days, at or near Holwell-mouth, by Melton Mowbray, there will be a general meeting of Gypsies from Leicestershire and the neighbouring counties, to celebrate the nuptials of Phoenix with the King's daughter. The Gypsies have undoubtedly a form of government amongst themselves, and to their King pay the most implicit obedience ; to this submission we may fairly attribute their apparent happiness. After a time he arrived at Longton in the Potteries, where, we are told, he was engaged to play for the dancing classes held at a young ladies' academy. The first and second of these at which he was present passed without incident, but at the third or fourth a big bouncing girl answering to the name of Mary Linyon persisted in treading on his toes. She did it on purpose quite clearly, and Major recognising this, and attracted no doubt by her handsome face and wilful demeanour, was not slow to take the cue she afforded him. He spoke to her afterwards, ostensibly about her behaviour, but what they really said to one another is better judged by the fact that a night or two later Mary, who was no more than fifteen, jumped from a bedroom window into his cart drawn up beneath it, on to a thick pile of straw surmounted by blankets and a feather bed. Fleeing the district, and staying in quiet country places, they eluded capture for some time, though a hue and cry was raised, and a reward offered for information leading to their arrest. In the end, however, they fell into the hands of the police, and Major was charged with abduction. Of this he declared he was innocent ; and so did Mary, who asserted from the witness-box that it was she who insisted on the elopement, not Major. As a result he was acquitted, whilst Mary, asked to decide whether she would return to her parents or remain with her lover, unhesitatingly chose the latter course.	T.W. Readers of the works of George Burrows [sic], especially "The Gipsies in Spain," will remember that one of the peculiarities of this class is to lavish enormous expense at their marriages - an illustration of which was presented on Wednesday. The happy pair were Mr. Boswell, who led to the hymenal altar his cousin, Elvina Boswell. These gypsies are encamped near Moseley Hole, fully a mile from Bilston, and the men get a good deal of money as musicians, by playing at dances, inns, &c. The bride on the occasion wore a very handsome white Leghorn hat, trimmed with broad white ribbon, and adorned with a fine plume of feathers; her dress was brocaded glacé satin. There were three bridesmaids, dressed in white, wearing similar hats to the bride; and the exquisite taste with which the ladies were arrayed was the theme of general admiration. The procession walked from the gypsies' encampment to St. Leonard's Church, and attracted great attention, the crowd of attendant gazers continually increasing as it approached Bilston, so that, on reaching the town, the bridal party walked between two lines of people, who pressed so much upon them that it was necessary for the police to exert themselves to maintain order. The church was crowded with spectators. The ceremony was performed by the vicar, the Rev. H. S. Fletcher, assisted by the Rev. R. J. Heafield, of St. Luke's; and at its close, the bells rang out a merry peal. The bridegroom invited the respectable persons present to visit the gypsies at their encampment, where a feast was provided. Several ladies and gentlemen accepted the invitation, and found a provision of a most ample character: beef and ham was provided in abundance, and ale and wine - and the visitors drank to the happiness of the newly-married couple from silver tankards, which were not the only articles of plate at the gypsies' tent. It may be mentioned, that so great was the throng after the marriage, that the party was compelled to take refuge in an adjoining inn until the streets were less full.
