1852	25 October	Retford, NTT	at the Sessions	ELIJAH BOSWELL, a gipsy tramp, was charged with stealing, in August last, one scythe and shaft, at Beckingham, the property of David Spittlehouse. Mr. Barker prosecuted, and called the prosecutor, who deposed that he left his scythe safe in a field, where he had been working, on the evening in question, and on the following morning it was gone. - P.c. Throsby apprehended the prisoner on the following day, with the property in his possession, at Gringley-on-the-Hill, and on being charged with the robbery, the prisoner stated that "he bought it of two navvies, on the Beckingham road, for 2s.". The property was clearly identified by the prosecutor. Prisoner, in his defence, told the same tale to the jury that he told to the constable, and, singular to relate, the jury gave him credit for it, and found him not guilty ! which was received with surprise by the court. The Chairman, in discharging the prisoner, told him he might consider himself a most fortunate fellow, for although the jury had taken what they thought a right view of his case, and give him credit for his defence, if such characters as the prisoner could manage to impress on the minds of the jury that when stolen property was found in their possession, that they had bought it of persons who were not forthcoming, on such occasions as these, the country would very soon be overrun with thieves, and as his character was well known (having been twice previously convicted), he hoped he would now take warning, and profit by the narrow escape he had just had.	<i>The Nottinghamshire Guardian</i> , 28 October 1852, 3

1853	19 November	Retford, NTT	in magistrates court	<p>For several years past a notorious gang of Gipsies known as "Boswell's Gang" has infested this and the adjoining counties, living in tents and camping in the various bye lanes, &c., to the great annoyance of the farmers, on whose property serious damage has at various time been committed, not only by pilfering everything that came their way, but by destroying their fences for the purpose of making fires, &c., and although they have been continually routed by the police, no effectual stop could be made to them, owing principally to no one caring to strike the first blow. A short time since the police received orders when they found any of them camping in lanes, &c., to pass this lawless gang from one to another until they had passed them out of the county. On Thursday night week about 30 of the above gang were found encamping near the "Chequer House," about four miles from Retford, and adjoining Mr. Holmes farm, where several potatoe pies had most likely been attracting their attention. Mr. Holmes not liking the looks of so formidable a gang so near his "pies," set a man of the name of Merrils to watch their movements, and about midnight one of the gang came to the "pies" and began to help himself, taking [<i>sic</i>] away with him several pecks. Information was forwarded to Retford, and superintendant Martin with two constables repaired to the "encampment" and apprehended all the men and conveyed them to the police station at Retford. On Saturday last they were brought before the magistrates in petty sessions, when they gave their names as Elijah Bosw ll [<i>sic</i>], William Boswell, James Boswell, and Elijah Boswell, jun. Several of the leading farmers from off the forest were in attendance, and gave evidence of the annoyance they were subjected to by the prisoners now in custody, who had been camping about them at various times for years. W. Boswell was committed for trial at the ensuing sessions for stealing the potatoes, and the evidence not being so clear against the other three, they were committed to the House of Correction at Southwell for a month each, as rogues and vagabonds. Such effective measures as these will soon put a stop to these wandering and almost lawless vagabonds.</p> <p>A ROYAL FAMILY. - There is in the county of Nottingham an extensive tribe of gipsies, headed by Elijah Boswell, who is styled the Gipsy King, a distinction which he is said to have lineally inherited from a long line of ancestors. Four of the tribe - viz., Elijah and three of his sons - got "into trouble" last week on account of some little matter of <i>meum</i>, and <i>tuum</i>, and were brought before the Retford bench of magistrates on Saturday, on a charge of felony, which ended in Elijah and two of his sons being sent to the treadmill for a month, and the other son being committed for trial. The Gipsy King has been married three times, and the following enumeration of his family is supplied from his own archives : - 1. Eliza, born among the ling in Mansfield forest ; 2. Henrietta, born in Thieves'-dale-lane, near Osberton ; Alfred, born in Treswell Back-lane ; 4. Walter, born on Kneesall-green ; 5. Adelaide, born in a lane between Langwith and Pleasley ; 6. It will be remembered that the evidence against the prisoner was that after the watch had been missed, he was seen by Richard Barnes and Thomas Butterworth to enter the yard, and to let the watch drop down his trousers on to the ground. It was picked up by Mrs., Butterworth. On being taken into custody he was searched, and a hole was found in his pocket sufficiently large to let the watch through. - The defence now set up by Mr. Lomax, who appeared for the prisoner, was an <i>alibi</i> . - The first witness called was Millicent Sarah Slinger, and she stated that she was the wife of the landlord of the Lodge Inn. On Wednesday evening, between five and six o'clock, she saw the prisoner in her house. He went out, and she afterwards saw him take a horse and donkey out of the yard, round the house end, go up the road towards Rakewood. There was a boy with the donkey. She saw him about seven o'clock. That was after the watch had been found, and he was then in the yard. His father ordered him out of the yard, and wanted him to go into the tent. She did not see the watch picked up, but she saw the woman with it in her hand. She went out after hearing the hallooing and shouting to see what was to do. It was possible when in the house to see all that passed in the yard. The Prisoner might have been there, but she did not see him. - William Slinger, son of last witness, deposed to seeing the prisoner about seven o'clock on Wednesday night. He was taking a horse towards Schofield Hall. He saw him again about eight o'clock. - Mr. Whitehead: If you go on at this rate you will prove our case most satisfactorily. - Witness further deposed to seeing the prisoner standing about twenty yards from the wall. He did not see him near the pump. - James Belton, a soldier, deposed that he did not see the prisoner there until the watch had been found. He saw the woman pick it up, and a young man wanted to take it from her, but she brought it into the house. During the scuffle that followed he saw the prisoner run down the garden from the tent into the yard, and ask what was to do. That was after the watch had been found. Witness stood in the kitchen, and it was possible from the kitchen to see what took place in the yard. Mrs. Butterworth had got to the door with the watch, and there was a crowd round the door. The prisoner was dressed in plaid trousers and waistcoat, and he wore a cap with a peak on it. There were two or three little boys about belonging to the gipsies. - In answer to Mr. Whitehead, witness said he heard that the prisoner had been struck by his father. - In answer to Mr. Lomax, he said he heard the prosecutor offered £10 to Mr. Helliwell if he would turn out his hands to beat the gipsies off the grounds. - John Thomas Butterworth was called for the prosecution, and he stated that he saw the prisoner in the yard when the watch was picked up, and he was about three yards off. There were seven prisoners, all women, and they formed part of a tribe of gipsies, who are encamped in a field behind the Griffin Hotel, Lower Broughton, where they had been for some time. - A handsome well-dressed woman named Mary Parker, was described as the queen of the tribe ; and the case against her was first heard. On Wednesday evening there was a gala at the encampment, and a large number of persons was attracted to the place. Dancing and fortune telling were the amusements, and as an admission fee of sixpence was charged, and a further fee of a shilling, if the oracles were consulted, there is reason to believe that the affair was profitable to the promoters. A char-woman, named Ellen M'Dermott paid a shilling to the queen to have her fortune told, and she now detailed the prophecy. The queen promised her a husband and a sum of money, and held out further inducements if the fee could be increased to half-a-crown ; but she had no more money. Sergeant Quick, of the Salford police force, came into the encampment just at that moment, and on learning that the queen had been telling fortunes he apprehended her. - In cross-examination by Mr. Cottingham, M'Dermott said that she asked to have her fortune told as a joke, and did not believe anything that the prisoner said to her. - Sylvester Boswell, a gipsy, was called for the defence, and he said there had been no fortune telling by any member of the tribe. - Mr. Trafford said he considered the case to be proved, and he committed the prisoner for seven days. - Mr. Cottingham said that the case would be taken either to the Queen's Bench or to the quarter sessions. - The case against Lavinia Boswell was next heard. In this case it was admitted that Sergeant Quick had sent a factory hand, named Ellen Walworth, to the gala, and that she had her fortune told by the prisoner, in order that she might appear as a witness. - The witness said, "The prisoner crossed my hand with a shilling which I had paid to her, and then shut it up in my hand, and told me to wish. - (Laughter.) When she opened my hand she said, "You have not wished for money, but for happiness, and you will have more of it than you expect. However high you have been you will be higher yet. You will have a very good summer. You will have three children." After hearing this witness said she thought it was time to be going. Sergeant Quick apprehended Boswell just as the prophecy was finished. - Mr. Cottingham said that the conduct of the police had been disgraceful. Gipsies were present and told fortunes on every racecourse ; and he hoped the Court would not convict under an obsolete piece of legislation which was a relic of the barbarous feelings of a former age. - Mr. Trafford convicted the prisoner, and sentenced her to seven days' imprisonment. - The other five women were discharged, as it was thought that a sufficient example had been made. 				Boswell, who led to the hymenal altar his cousin, Elvina Boswell. These gipsies are encamped near Moseley Hole, fully a mile from Bilston, and the men get a good deal of money as musicians, by playing at dances, inns, &c. The bride on the occasion wore a very handsome white Leghorn hat, trimmed with broad white ribbon, and adorned with a fine plume of feathers ; her dress was brocaded glacé satin. There were three bridesmaids, dressed in white, wearing similar hats to the bride ; and the exquisite taste with which the ladies were arrayed was the theme of general admiration. The procession walked from the gipsies' encampment to St. Leonard's Church, and attracted great attention, the crowd of attendant gazers continually increasing as it approached Bilston, so that, on reaching the town, the bridal party walked between two lines of people, who pressed so much upon them that it was necessary for the police to exert themselves to maintain order. The church was crowded with spectators. The ceremony was performed by the vicar, the Rev. H. S. Fletcher, assisted by the Rev. R. J. Heafield, of St. Luke's ; and at its close, the bells rang out a merry peal. The bridegroom invited the respectable persons present to visit the gipsies at their encampment, where a feast was provided. Several ladies and gentlemen accepted the invitation, and found a provision of a most ample character : beef and ham was provided in abundance, and ale and wine – and the visitors drank to the happiness of the newly-married couple from silver tankards, which were not the only articles of plate at the gipsies' tent. It may be mentioned, that so great was the throng after the marriage, that the party was compelled to take refuge in an adjoining inn until the streets were less full. The bride was presented with a handsome bible by the Rev. H. S. Fletcher.
