1844	9 April	Surfleet, LIN	at a public house all day	ELIAS BOSS, aged 17, Charged with having, on the 8th of April last, at Hammeringham, stolen two mares, the property of Jane Blades. - JOHN BURD GRAY, aged 48, also charged with this offence, pleaded guilty. The prisoners were gipsies, and Gray is said to be a son of the gipsy king. There were many of the wandering tribe in court to hear the result, and among the number was the monarch. On the night of the 8th of April the two horses were safe, and the next morning the two prisoners, who had been seen in the neighbourhood of prosecutrix's house the day before the horses were stolen, brought the animals to the house of a Mr. Merriman, at Surfleet, 30 miles from Cammeringham [<i>sic</i>]. The men stopped all day, and then went away taking their horses without paying for their keep. About a month afterwards Christopher Blades, in consequence of certain information he had received, went to Ipswich, and there he found the prisoner Boss riding one of the stolen horses into an inn yard. He gave him into custody, and prisoner said if the horse was his he was to take it. Prisoner told the constable that he was brought into this mess by Gray, who had brought the horses to the camp where his mother was on the night of the 8th of May, saying he had bought them at Sleaford Fair. He gave the constable a description of Gray, which partly led to his apprehension. Gray, however, on being sworn, said that they were both together when the horses were taken, and that he took one and prisoner the other. - Mr. Macauley made an able defence for the prisoner. The <i>Judge</i> , having summed up, the jury returned a verdict of <i>guilty</i> . 1844	20 July	Lincoln, LIN	tried at the Assizes	Elias Boss 17 [County Assizes 20 th July] Horse Stealing 10 Years John Budd Gray 48 D° D° 12 Years ELIAS BOSS, aged 17, and JOHN BURD GRAY, aged 42, two gipsies, were indicted for stealing two mares at Hammeringham on the 8th of April, the property of Jas. Blades. When called upon to plead, Boss replied that he was not guilty ; but Gray said that Boss' statement was false, and that both were guilty. He added they went together to Hammeringham for the purpose of stealing the mares, it being arranged that each should steal one, and that they should ride off in different directions. A plea of <i>guilty</i> was therefore entered against Gray ; and Boss stood his trial. The prisoners were seen with the mares taking them through the country, and 20 days after one was found at Ipswich, in the possession of Boss, who gave it up, and said that Gray had hired him to take care of the mare, bringing both to the camp, and placing one in his possession ; from the information given by Boss, Gray was apprehended at Leverton. Boss was sentenced to <i>ten</i> and Gray to <i>twelve years' transportation</i> . Some gipsies amongst the audience implored the Judge to be merciful and on the sentence being passed some of the females set up a dreadful howl. 1887	11 January	Wareside, HRT	died	DEATH FROM EXPOSURE. - An inquest was held on Wednesday at the Fox, Babbs Green, Wareside, before Mr. T. J. Swoorder, coroner, respecting the death of a labourer named John Boswell, aged 62. It appeared that deceased left the White Horse public-house on Monday night at ten o'clock to go home, having previously given his violin (by which instrument he gained his living) to the potman to take care of till the next day as he was afraid of slipping down and spoiling it. Deceased was quite sober. He did not go home that night, but no alarm was felt by his relatives, as he often stayed out, and the next morning he was found by a labourer named Wheeler lying on the bank of the Bourne with his legs and back in the water. He was about six yards from the footpath which goes along the top of the bank, and had evidently slipped over on his way home. Deceased was then alive, but died a few minutes afterwards. Dr. E. H. Mr. Miller prosecuted, and the prisoners were undefended. The prisoners, it appeared, were gypsies, and had been camping in the neighbourhood of Beighton, where the prosecutor kept a public-house. He deposed that Boswell, one of the prisoners, ran up a score of 4s. 6d. with him, and that Smith, the other prisoner, came on the 5th of the present month, and inquired if any of his young people had set anything on. Told him about the 4s. 6d., when he said he was master of the camp, and producing what appeared to be a 10l. note, requested change for the purpose of paying it. Prisoner said it was a good note, and Mirfin gave him a 5l. note, and the remainder in sovereigns and half sovereigns. He paid the 4s. 6d. with a half sovereign. Paid the note to a person named Crooks, and it being discovered to be worthless, it was eventually returned to him again. Previous, however, to its being returned, Smith came again, and having stayed till all the other company was gone, wanted change for another 10l. note. On ascertaining the paper to be useless, went to Sheffield, and gave information to the police. Mr. Raynor, superintendent of police, caused the prisoners to be apprehended at Sheffield on Tuesday, the 11th, and two flash notes were found on Smith. They were exactly similar to that passed to Mirfin. The documents purporting to be notes were produced and read, and turned out to be a kind of shop bill for a paper hanging establishment at Birmingham, printed on paper similar in appearance to that used for country notes ; the general arrangement of the printing, and the appearance of the paper, altogether approximating to a genuine note. Smith, in defence, said he had found the notes, and Boswell offered no defence. Smith was found Guilty, and Boswell acquitted. A short time since the police received orders when they found any of them camping in lanes, &c., to pass this lawless gang from one to another until they had passed them out of the county. On Thursday night week about 30 of the above gang were found encamping near the "Chequer House," about four miles from Retford, and adjoining Mr. Holmes farm, where several potatoe pies had most likely been attracting their attention. Mr. Holmes not liking the looks of so formidable a gang so near his "pies," set a man of the name of Merrils to watch their movements, and about midnight one of the gang came to the "pies" and began to help himself, taking [sic] away with him several pecks. In formation was forwarded to Retford, and superintendant Martin with two constables repaired to the "encampment" and apprehended all the men and conveyed them to the police station at Retford. On Saturday last they were brought before the magistrates in petty sessions, when they gave their names as Elijah Bosw II [sic], William Boswell, James Boswell, and Elijah Boswell, jun. Several of the leading farmers from off the forest were in attendance, and gave evidence of the annoyance they were subjected to by the prisoners now in custody, who had been camping about them at various times for years. W. Boswell was committed for trial at the ensuing sessions for stealing the potatoes, and the evidence not being so clear against the other three, they were committed to the House of Correction at Southwell for a month each, as rogues and vagabonds. 				A ROYAL FAMILY. - There is in the county of Nottingham an extensive tribe of gipsies, headed by Elijah Boswell, who is styled the Gipsy King, a distinction which he is said to have lineally inherited from a long line of ancestors. Four of the tribe - viz., Elijah and three of his sons - got "into trouble" last week on account of some little matter of <i>meum</i> , and <i>tuum</i> , and were brought before the Retford bench of magistrates on Saturday, on a charge of felony, which ended in Elijah and two of his sons being sent to the treadmill for a month, and the other son being committed for trial. At the commencement of the investigation, Mr. Mackrill, solicitor, of Barton, who appeared on behalf of the prisoners, submitted to the bench that the charge against the female prisoner could not be sustained, inasmuch as the law considered that, in such cases as the present, the wife is presumed to act under the influence of her husband. Mr. Gee, who attended in the absence of Mr. Graburn, the magistrates' clerk, said that he should not offer evidence in support of the charge against the woman, as her relation to the other prisoner was only just ascertained ; and she was thereupon discharged. The case was then proceeded with against the male prisoner. The plaintiff, on being sworn, stated that he missed the mare from his paddock on the morning already mentioned, and that he immediately gave information of the robbery, and bills were circulated offering a reward of 5 <i>l.</i> 5 <i>s.</i> for the recovery, and the apprehension and conviction of the offenders - that he had subsequently seen the animal in Barton, in charge of the superintendent of police, and that he immediately identified her as his property. Several witnesses from Barton and Yorkshire swore positively that they saw the mare in question in possession of the prisoner, in the various places through which he passed, in company with some female gipsies, and their concurrent testimony was not in the slightest degree shaken by cross-examination. Mr. Batty, the Barton superintendent of police, stated that he traced the prisoners from Barton waterside to Guisborough, in Yorkshire, where he apprehended both him and his wife at a lodging-house, but the mare was not then to be found. Having secured his prisoners, he brought them in custody to Barton, and lodged them in the new lock-up ; he had previously given instructions to Mr. Roberts, superintendent of police at Scarboro', to keep a sharp look-out after the mare, as he had reason to suppose she was secreted somewhere in that locality. Mr. Mackrill objected to Mr. Batty's statement being received as evidence, beyond the mere fact of his apprehending the prisoner at Guisborough ; at the same time he passed a high eucumium upon the zeal and perseverance which Mr. Batty had shown from the time he received the information of the robbery to his taking the prisoner into custody. The bench decided against Mr. Mackrill's objection, but appended a note of it at the foot of the examination. Mr. Roberts, superintendent of police at Scarboro', stated that on the 17th inst. he received information from a farmer named Baker, that he had heard the faint neigh of a horse or mare on the rocks, at a place called Barnscliff, near Scarboro', but that there was no animal in sight - that he and Baker subsequently ascended the rocks, and found the mare of which he was in search, on an outer ledge of a ridge of rocks, with her four feet tied together, whereby it was impossible to walk about, and that, from the appearance of her feet, which were actually fly-blown, it was evident she had used great exertions to free herself - that there was not a blade of grass nor a drop of water within her reach, and that she must have been there, <i>without sustenance of any kind, from the 9th to the 16th instant!</i> - that it was utterly impossible she could have got to the place where she was discovered <i>after</i> her feet had been tied, but that she must have been secured in the manner described upon her reaching the ledge on the rocks. Mr. Mackrill cross-examined the several witnesses with considerable skill and ingenuity but failed to invalidate their testimony in any important particular. The prisoner, upon being asked by the bench if he had anything to say, merely replied, "not just now." Mr. Barton then said he must stand committed to take his trial at the next Lincoln assizes, for felony, and the prosecutor and witnesses were bound over for their appearance. There were several gipsies, both male and female, present during the proceedings, and, upon hearing that their associate was committed for trial, commenced a wild and terrifying howling. The mare, which excited a vast deal of curiosity, was tied to the railings in front of the justice-room during the hearing of the case ; she is of a dark colour, with three white feet, and white face ; the latter, however, had been stained with something, evidently for the purpose of disguising her. She did not appear much the worse for the long abstinence which she had undergone, although her legs, from the tightness of the ligatures with which they had been bound, were very much excoriated. The mare was missed on the 5th ; and on that morning the prisoner was seen with two horses and two women at Barton, between 30 and 40 miles distant. He crossed in the ferry-boat to Hessle, taking with him one of the women and the two horses, one of the latter being Mr. Ostick's mare, the identity of which was proved by Wm. Richards, of Barton, and Thos. Higgs, one of the ferrymen. The identity was likewise proved by Wm. Wardin, of Hessle, and Wm. Wilson, butcher, of Scarborough, which place the prisoner reached on the 7th ; but at that time the white face had been painted red or raddled ; the prosecutor thought it had been stained with blackberry juice. - Abraham Batty, superintendent constable of Barton, having heard of Mr. Ostick's loss, and having learned that the prisoner had crossed the ferry with a mare like that which had been stolen, went in pursuit, and traced the prisoner to Beverley, Cottingham, Driffeld, Sledmore, Scarboro', and across the moors to Guisboro' ; it was ascertained that the mare had been with the prisoner at Scalding, near Scarboro', but beyond that place the animal could not be traced. - The services of Rd. Roberts, superintendent of police at Scarboro', (who assisted in apprehending the prisoner at Guisboro',) were then engaged, and he initiated a search on the moors which lasted from Monday until the following Sunday. At length, Roberts got among the rocks at Barns Cliff, and having heard what seemed to him the neighing of a horse, he climbed down the crags, and discovered on a ledge of the rocks the mare with its fore legs and its hind legs tied, and very weak and exhausted for want of food ; the mare's legs were cut at the part where they were tied, and the sores caused thereby were fly-blown. On getting the animal from the cliff, it snapped ravenously at the leaves of trees and everything it saw in the shape of food. It was brought back into Lincolnshire, and returned to the prosecutor. - In behalf of the prisoner, <i>Mr. Flood</i> dwelt upon the fact that the mare was found at a place many miles distant from the town where the prisoner was apprehended, and contested that it was very probable the witnesses who said they saw the prisoner with the mare at Barton and other places were mistaken as to his identity. - <i>Guilty : ten years' transportation.</i> - <i>Mr. Wilmore</i> applied for the costs of pursuing the prisoner which had been incurred by Batty and Roberts, and the Judge allowed them. - Before the prisoner was removed, an elderly gipsy-looking man, who was said to be his father, stood up in the body of the court, and vehemently implored the Judge to reverse the sentence ; and at the same time a female of the gipsy tribe screamed out and then fainted.
