1852	23 January	Lilford, Abbotsham, DEV	death of mother	<p>HABIT STRONGER THAN LIFE. - As proof the strength of earthly usages, the following is worthy of notice : - Some time since a female named Matilda Boswell, (daughter of the late king of the gipsies) called upon Mr. W. H. Acland, of this town, for medical advice; who, on perceiving that she was extremely ill, persuaded her to take some rooms in or near the town, instead of living in the tent, which was then fixed at Lilford, in the parish of Abbotsham, when he generously promised to do any thing he could for her relief, free of charge. Her reply was at once prompt and characteristic of this wandering race of Egyptian Ishmaelites: "Do you think, said she, I could leave the tent, were my fathers and mothers were born and died? [sic] No, my good gentleman, God bless you for your kind offer, nevertheless I cannot live in your dangerous houses: I was born in the tent, and in the tent I am determined to die." And there, indeed, on Friday last, aged 51 years, this romantic creature breathed her last, amidst the bitterest lamentations of the whole camp. To the honour of the gentry in the neighbourhood, be it recorded, every attention was shown to the dying wanderer, and spiritual consolation administered, for which they received the grateful thanks and tears of the whole party. Notwithstanding the very severe gales with which we have been visited during the past week in such a manner was her tent constructed, that she rested on her dying pillow as warm, soft, and safe as the minion of luxury on a downy pillow; and thus died Matilda Boswell, in that same tent in which she "Had cherily passed her Summer days [sic] In sunny nooks and sultry ways;" a remarkable example of the force of that second nature - habit.</p>	<i>The North Devon Journal</i> , 29 January 1852, 5

He was quite a link with past scenes and events of olden times, and no fair in the neighbourhood seemed complete without the presence of this wandering minstrel and we must say the people much enjoyed a dance or jig to his old-fashioned tunes. He was a typical country-fiddler, with no settled home, and he slept generally in a stable or other outbuilding of a village inn. On Saturday last he attended a fair held at the hamlet of Nuthampstead in Barkway parish, staying at the Woodman public house kept by Mr. George Martin. On Tuesday, when the heat was so great, he complained of pains in his head and apparently suffered from heat apoplexy. The next day the landlord found him lying in the stable much worse, so he sent for Dr. Downs, who arrived between 10 and 11 a.m. The doctor saw the deceased was seriously ill, as he had vomited blood, so he ordered his removal to the Buntingford Union. Arthur Barker, a labourer working for Mr. Martin, was bringing the poor man in a cart to the Union, and had got beyond Anstey, near to the village windmill, when the deceased suddenly called out "George." Barker, who was leading the horse, at once stopped and got into the cart, only to find the old fiddler was dead. An inquest was held on the body yesterday (Friday). What may have been the expectations of the visitors and the notions they entertained of the performances of the gipsies we know not, but it appears that a little disappointment was felt by them because they had heard and seen so little of the characteristics of gipsy life. We feel bound in justice to the gipsies to state that they are not wholly responsible for this. It appears the gipsies were advised, for various reasons, to lower the price of admission to sixpence each, which brought a much larger number than was anticipated, and caused an inconvenient crowding around the area allotted for the dancing, so that many persons could not obtain even a glimpse of the dancing party. And then the rain which came down not only interrupted the proceedings but considerably marred the pleasure of the evening. To avoid the rain a rush was made to the tents for shelter. Up to eight o'clock persons continued to apply for admission, even after the rain had prevented the gipsies from continuing their performances ; but we learn from one who heard it that Mr. Smith, who occupies the first tent, distinctly told them that the field could <i>not</i> remain open much longer that evening, and advised them not to enter, as nothing particular was going on ; therefore if any disappointment was felt by these late comers the blame should not be attached to the gipsies but to themselves.
