1839	July	Northampton, NTH	William & Ambrose at the Assizes	William Boswell, aged 51, and Ambrose Boswell, aged 21, were indicted for killing a sheep, the property of Mr. Johnson, of Preston Capes. The two prisoners were gipsies, and were living in their tents, about two miles from the place where the sheep was killed. As soon as the shepherd found the skin, he carried it home to his master, who, directly sent off to Woodford for two bloodhounds. They were taken to the spot where the sheep was killed, and they immediately hit off the scent, the one carrying it on to the gipsies' camp, the other following the track of the shepherd to the residence of Mr. Johnson. 				to bay at a grinding machine, which, on being searched, was found to contain fresh mutton ; in the pot was a fore quarter, and in a vessel a leg in salt. The mutton was compared and fitted to parts of the skin. The jury, however, acquitted both prisoners.

Colvile, at the Magistrates' Clerk's Office, Worcester, on the charge of having violently assaulted Mr. W. Hicken, landlord of the Castle Hill public-house. The prisoners were drinking at the prosecutor's house on Sunday week, when they created a disturbance and an attempt was made to eject them. Armed with thick sticks, they attacked the inmates of the house, and Mr. Hicken received severe injuries. At last they were got outside, where they continued for some time breaking the windows and doing other damage. Shortly after they had decamped P.C. Wall found two of the men hiding in a ditch ; the others were apprehended afterwards.
