He could get no reply to his question. He went away, directing P.C. Clarke to remain, and on going back about twenty minutes later he found the cart still there. Broadwell, prosecutor's son, said on the afternoon of the 7th inst., while going from Gilmorton to Kimcote with a cart load of coal, he saw a number of vans, from which two men came, one of whom asked him to give him a lump of coal, the other going to the back of the cart. Witness replied that the coal was not his to give away, whereupon the man went to the back of the back of the cart and took an armful of coal, and went with it into the field where the vans were.
