



DIRECTORY OF TRAVELLING PHOTOGRAPHERS

INTRODUCTION

WHAT IS MEANT BY A TRAVELLING PHOTOGRAPHER?

There does not seem to be an agreed definition of a travelling photographer, as yet. This is compounded by the variety of words used to describe them, as noted in the search terms listed below. Meanwhile, the following has been used by the author as a working description:

'Those who take photographs for payment, travel from place to place to seek customers, and are not primarily taking photographs for their own expression or enjoyment.'

This is to try and distinguish them from leisure photographers, landscape photographers and travel photographers, though there may be some overlap. As illustrated later, there was some fluidity in the careers and operations of many early photographers so 'travelling' could have been part of their lifestyle even if they also had static studios or were settled in one place for part of the time.

BACKGROUND TO THE RESEARCH

The following research arose from initial searches for 'van dwellers' in the British Newspaper Archive, connected to interest in the lives of Romanies and Travellers. Curiosity aroused by a couple of specific accounts led to more detailed work on the role of Joseph Caddick (1846-1926)¹ a remarkable travelling photographer, showman and campaigner for travellers' rights, whose wider family were also involved in photography and early cinema.

It soon became evident that relatively little had been written about travelling photographers (TPs) or their lives, or indeed their emergence and spread across the country. The impression, in so far as it exists, was and is not favourable, and this is reflected in the newspaper reports, illustrated below. Also there has been an assumption in many quarters that TPs were necessarily less skilled and lacked artistic quality. Without the information to match surviving photographs to photographers, this cannot be proved. However, travelling photographers provided a service over many decades, especially to remote and rural communities, as well as those who had limited opportunities to go to a settled photographer but could perhaps manage a quick visit to a booth or van at a market or fair.

Further searches were made to understand the wider context and it quickly became clear there were considerable numbers of TPs even within 20 years of the invention of photography. There were very early photographers who were travelling, or at least visiting other locations in the 1840s, and by the 1850s many had vans for their equipment. Although early TPs seem to have been sole traders, many of the census records in the second half of the 19th century show travellers grouped together around fairs and markets. One record often led to others in the same vicinity, and to evidence of extended family networks that might span several generations.

The origins of the TPs often seem humble, with many coming from labouring or artisan backgrounds. Others were clearly connected with what might be termed 'traditional' Romany or travelling activities, such as hawking, peddling, confectionery and bazaar keeping; often these multiple roles were held simultaneously. Frequently they developed in parallel with that of the showmen, with exhibitions, entertainments and sideshows. Some records also marked the transition from stallholder to photographer to film operator to cinema manager and sometimes a more settled career. However, other occupations before, during and after include artist, butler, cab driver, framework knitter, gardener, grocers' assistant, lock maker, weaver, woollen draper and many more.

There is evidence of frequent movement between settled and travelling roles, within and beyond photography. This applies to recognised photographers such as Oliver F. X. Sarony, and there is even mention that the photographer and later film pioneer, William E. Friese-Green might have spent part of his early career travelling. Then there were pioneering families like the Monson brothers from Essex who, separately and together, were involved at different times in taking out early licences, operating studios, travelling to other areas on tours and extended visits using local premises, teaching photography and even taking out patents related to photographic processes. All of this was combined with intersecting careers in architecture, surveying, engineering and art, particularly portrait painting. It is clear the 'travelling' or 'itinerant' photographer encompassed many different roles, and often a high degree of innovation and flexibility.

Some TPS can be tracked over many years as photographers though it is not always explicit whether they were travelling. Many have a single reference and then disappear or change occupation. However, it has obviously not been possible to investigate everyone thoroughly, and as other records and better transcriptions emerge online, there will be much more for others to find out and record. And it is hoped that others will start to match photographs with TPs, where the latter have used named backing cards or insignia.

One of the important indicators is reference to caravans or travelling vans, though some photographers clearly used hand carts and others the growing railway network. Those already familiar with Romany and Traveller history will recognise other signs including known surnames, patterns of family marriage, related occupations, variety in children's birthplaces, and locations at traditional stopping places.

There are some photographers who may not be described specifically as 'travelling photographers' but, given their locations and associations, sometime over several censuses, the likelihood is that they were travelling for at least part of the time. Some settled photographers might have family members who travelled. Of special interest is that there are indeed some photographers who advertised themselves as 'Travelling Photographer' on the reverse of their photographic mount. In these cases, at least, we can be sure of whom and what they were!

USING THE DIRECTORY

This list was intended as a starting point to find travelling photographers, primarily in the period from the 1840s-1901. Due to the unanticipated number of potential entries the focus has narrowed for this first version to the period 1841-1881. However, there are dozens of later entries which have been saved pending extension of the lists to cover the period 1882-1901. Many of the photographers would have had a transitory career, both in terms of time and space, and may not be easily identified by other means.

The entries have been taken from a variety of sources including Ancestry, FindMyPast, British Newspaper Archive, Newspapers.com, online historical journals & books, with a wide range of finds in census & parish records. Newspaper entries of the period tend to focus on unusual, salacious, or criminal reports: these are perhaps over-represented and may distort perceptions of the travelling lifestyle.

Brief indications have been given of date, name, place, and context where known, and appropriate. Not all sources provide full details, and some locations are surmised from other information in nearby text. Further research is needed to extend the listings for Ireland, Scotland and Wales.

Where dates have been found readily these are given but note that dates of birth and death may be approximate by several years, or totally inaccurate in many cases, depending on the original record. However, they can indicate a time period in which further searches may be concentrated. In general, the reference and date are for the earliest instance of someone found as a photographer. That does not mean it is the earliest date they were earning a living through photography, merely that earlier records have not yet been located. Events have been recorded once but note that there may be other and different accounts, especially in newspapers around the same date, possibly with more details. Some associated material has been included where it might provide background or an early example of its kind.

Person and place names are often inconsistent within and from record to record, and over time, so extra care needs to be taken if searching. Note that similarities or differences cannot be assumed as proof of people being the same person, or not! Please remember that early spellings and transcriptions were not fixed: recorders may not have been fully literate; speakers may have had strong accents, elisions or burrs; some written characters are easily mistaken in transcription e.g. H, K, M, N; and not a few travellers deliberately hid or obscured their true identity, if indeed they had only one.

Where there are different travelling photographers in the same record they have usually been itemised separately but note that there are some additional names given in notes e.g. family, employees, key witnesses, other photographers. It is likely that some entries are for the same person though this should not be assumed without corroborative evidence as names were often repeated in the same families. A little licence has been taken where references to the, probably, same person can throw light on their identity or activities.

Readers will note that some persons have more than one entry, and others may not be proven travelling photographers. This can be for several reasons. Mainly it is intended to provide clues for better identification, illustration of career development and, in a few cases, examples of related activity such as trade in photographic goods and travelling vans. On balance the compiler has included items where it was felt it would add richer context to understanding the lives of travelling photographers, individually and often as a group of families within the wider travelling community. And of course, there are some which are irresistible due to their unique or humorous qualities...

Additional entries or evidence are welcomed. If possible, please give brief details and sources, as demonstrated below, so that they can be checked against originals. There are surely many entries, and stories, to be found especially when optical character recognition and transcriptions become more accurate.

SEARCH TERMS

The key words that have been used include various combinations of the following terms and derivations: artist, photographer, showman, hawker, travel/(I)ing/itinerant, van/caravan, studio, photo/graph/ic/ical, glasshouse etc. Earlier records tend to use the phrase 'photographic artist' rather than photographer, and the term 'photographist' has also been found. However, as hinted above, it is not always apparent that someone is a photographer or a travelling photographer without cross-referencing between various records. For example, there are census records where the enumerator has simply put 'showman' or 'hawker' for all the people in group of travellers, without distinguishing exactly what they were doing.

Where using online family history sites, please note that the terms above may appear in different parts of records: using open searches may reveal more returns. For example, 'caravan' can appear in the address but also under occupation, while in censuses there may be enumerator notes or added details in the first page where the enumeration district is described. Where a likely location is already known, but names are problematic, then searching the last pages of the enumeration district or section may yield results: the end pages are where enumerators tended to record 'vagrants' or those not living in houses but in barns, outhouses, caravans, and tents.

It is important to always check both the transcription and the original record as they can differ substantially: full information may not always be saved directly into family trees. Ideally, records should be checked across more than one family history site as the methods of scanning, transcription and searching are not identical, with results hidden in one but revealed in another.

SEARCH SORT

To show the development of travelling photography throughout the 19th century entries have been sorted by year when activity appears to have taken place, which may not be the year in which it was reported. Census entries have been grouped at the beginning of the census year; census dates given below. To search for a particular person or place, go to top of first page and press the 'Control+f' buttons at the same time to carry out a search.

OTHER KEY SOURCES

A short list of sources which may be more readily available is given below. Other academic or specialist publications with relevant content exist but may be difficult to access. For the period 1839-1855 additional reference should be made to the key work by Bernard & Pauline Heathcote, details below. If searching for travelling photographers therein note that they use the term 'itinerant'. There appears to be very little overlap between the Heathcotes' itinerants, or their listings in general, and the entries below. However, some general entries do include those who appear to have been travelling for at least part of their career.

There are a number of lists of photographers and studios online, including some indexes for specific counties and major, and a growing number of published guides to photographers for particular areas. Perhaps understandably, listings of photographers tend to relate to those with fixed premises and a permanent address more likely to be found in commercial directories and on the mounts of photographs themselves. However, caution is needed: many photographers travelled at some time or other, perhaps starting their career on the road before settling.
