1803	mid-March	Sydenham, KNT	at the Sessions	<p>Benjamin Craggs and Arthur Bowers were indicted for the wilful murder of Samuel Matthews (commonly called the Dulwich Hermit) at Sydenham, on the 28th of December last.</p> <p>Mr. Morris stated, the man who had been killed was well known in Dulwich and Sydenham, for having resided near forty years in a cave dug by himself, and on the 28th of December he was found murdered near his wretched habitation. The murder appeared to have been committed by thrusting a hook stick into the mouth of his cave, and dragging him out by the jaw, for the under jaw was completely broken. The circumstances which led to suspicion upon the Prisoners were as follow : - They were gypsies and chimney sweeps, having no fixed habitation, but at that time fixing their tents on Sydenham Common. On the morning after the murder, they were seen coming towards Sydenham, it was as early as two o'clock, and they had a conversation with the patrole, in which they told him that they had seen old Matthews the evening before, who appeared frightened at them, and told them to be gone. It would also appear, that as they were going to the Office for examination, the young one, who was son-in-law to the other, said, " Father, we must both be in one story, or we shall be done." He should also prove another important fact, which was, that on the morning after the murder, one of the same party who had been taken up (but against whom the Bill was thrown out) at the shop of Mr. Carpenter, at Sydenham, told the Prisoners that old Matthews had been murdered, to which Craggs replied, "I know not." This was at eight o'clock, when in point of fact the murder was not discovered until eleven." From these circumstances, he thought the Jury would infer the guilt of the Prisoners.</p> <p>Richard Hicks deposed, that he was Patrole at Sydenham. On the 27th of December, about a quarter before six, he saw Craggs and his wife on Sydenham Hill, about half a mile from the cave of the deceased: they were going towards Dulwich.</p> <p>P. Darcy, Constable of Sydenham, saw the two prisoners on the 28th, about twenty minutes after two in the morning, at his partner's watch-box, about a mile and a half from Matthews's cave. He asked them what made them get up so early. Craggs said they had mistaken the time. The boy (Bowers) said, "I told you it was too early." The witness told him to sit down in his watch-box ; they staid there till six. In conversation, he said, Me and my brother went yesterday to see old Matthews, and added, that they found him in his cave ; that he seemed much frightened, bade them go along, for he had nothing to buy, nothing to sell, nor any thing to give them. Hs witness asked them where they lay ; they said just by the swing gate on Sydenham Common. The day after the witness laid the information against them and took them up.</p> <p>William Morris said, he was one of the party who was conveying the prisoners to gaol the day after the murder. Bowers said, "Father, be sure you keep in one story, for if we get into two stories we shall be done."</p> <p>This being the whole of the evidence, the Learned Judge told the Jury, it was much too slight to take away the lives of two men, and advised them to acquit the prisoners, which they did.</p>	<i>Bell's Weekly Messenger</i> , 27 March 1803, 100
