**CHILCOTT, Richard alias LEE**

YESTERDAY, among thirty-two disorderly fellows taken at one sweep in their nightly club, held at the Running Horse, St. Giles's Pound, *Richard Chilcott*, alias *Lee*, was brought up for examination. He proved to be one of the daring gang of Gypsies who have committed various burglaries in Essex, particularly that atrocious one in the house of farmer GROUT, of Manuden, in that county.

It appeared, on the examination, that the Rev. Mr. B. DUDLEY had received information, as a Magistrate of Essex, that the Running Horse was the general rendezvous of these itinerant house-breakers, two of whom were already secured in Chelmsford gaol. It was therefore previously concerted between Justice ADDINGTON and that Gentleman, that a strong party of the Police Officers, with a search warrant, and properly armed, should accompany the latter, who only could identify the person of Chilcot [sic], alias Lee : the principal part of the covey were in consequence taken at ten o'clock the night before by surprize, in their Club, attended by their doxies, and, after some resistance, were secured, and removed to a proper place of confinement ; but the offender particularly sought for, did not appear amongst them. Suspecting he might be concealed in the cellar, Mr. Dudley afterwards, with a friend and a Police Officer, went down therein, where they found and secured four men, hid in an interior coal-hole, amongst whom he discovered *Chilcot*, alias *Lee*. On the prisoner's examination yesterday morning, no doubt arising as to the identity of this notorious ruffian, he was committed to Chelmsford gaol, on Mr. DUDLEY'S warrant, and immediately removed in a chaise for that place of confinement, under the escort of Carpmal and Sayers.

*Lee* is a young active man, and was traced by the singularity of wearing silver buttons on his fustian coat, made out of reduced dollars : this coat, however, he had the address to exchange for an old great coat, during his night's confinement in the watch-house.

*William Smith*, a Gypsey Fidler, who pretends to belong to the Guards, and *Lee's* wife, were committed by Mr. ADDINGTON, on suspicion of being accessaries [sic] in the above burglaries : most of the others were remanded for want of sureties.

Chilcot, alias *Lee*, is found now to belong to a Gypsey family of that name, consisting of a father and five sons, all of whom were brought from Dulwich to Bow-street in October last, on suspicion of divers felonies ; but no particular charge being then adduced against them, they were liberated, owing to the excellent character given them by the landlord of the public-house, near Norwood, formerly kept by the father of the late celebrated Miss CATLEY.

The sister-in-law to Chilcot, alias *Lee*, was taken into custody with the men at the Running Horse, and, on being searched before the Magistrates, a gold seal, some silver buttons, various other trinkets, and some colouring for the skin, were found in her pockets : she was also committed, on suspicion of being an accessory [sic] with *Lee*.

GYPSIES. - A daring robbery was committed a short time since in Essex, by a gang of Gypsies, &c. Some of them are now in Chelmsford Gaol for the same.

On Monday evening the Rev. BATE DUDLEY, a Magistrate for Essex, and in whose neighbourhood the robbery was committed, made application to the Sitting Magistrate at the Public Office, Bow-street, for a party of Officers to attend him to a club to be held that evening in St. Giles's, having received information that one of the Gypsies concerned in the robbery was to be at the meeting; in consequence of which a party of Officers went to the public-house called the Flying Horse, the corner of Bainbridge-street, St. Giles's, where they found a Club assembled, called a *Cock and Hen Club*, in a large back room, among whom was *Richard Lee*, alias *Chilcot*, who is charged with being a party concerned in the robbery. *Lucy*, his sister, was of the company ; the rest of the company consisted of coal-heavers, dust-men, chimney-sweepers, &c.

The Officers secured *Lee*, alias *Chilcot*, and his sister, and thirty-one more.

After an examination before the Sitting Magistrate in Bow-street, *Lee*, alias *Chilcot*, was fully committed for trial to Chelmsford. - He had on his coat, when he was apprehended, forty-four dollars instead of buttons. - He is one of those who were apprehended a short time since in Norwood on suspicion. Some of the others were committed as disorderly persons.

| 1863 | mid-June    | Barking, ESS    | charge with abetting a fight | Manslaughter at East Ham – Inquest on the body of William Nicholls, 24, a Gypsy, who was killed in a fight with John Lee, another Gypsy. It appeared that the deceased and Lee belonged to a tribe of Gypsies encamped on waste ground at North Woolwich. A few days ago a quarrel took place between two others of the tribe, named Lazarus Smith and Harran, but who, after fighting together for three hours, they shook hands and became friends again. On returning to the camp, however, the wife of John Lee, and the mother of the deceased Nicholls, took the matter up and fought with each other, when Lee interfered on behalf of his wife, and deceased on behalf of his mother. This fight was the subject of investigations the next day . . . at the Woolwich Police Court, when the case was dismissed. On the 15th inst., the camp broke up, and the whole tribe, numbering upwards of a hundred persons, proceeded towards East Ham. On their route Lee and Nicholls selected a spot to fight; feeling dissatisfied at the magistrate not dealing with the case, and after fighting for an hour and a half, Lee was heard to declare he had had enough and wished to give in. The deceased, however, persisted in continuing the fight, saying he was quite fresh and could “fight through a summer’s day.” They again fought and in the last round Lee struck the deceased a heavy blow under the left jaw, knocking him down and rendering him insensible. Medical aid was obtained, but the deceased expired half an hour afterwards. A post-mortem examination made on the body proved death to have resulted from an effusion of blood to the brain by a rupture of one of the blood vessels, produced by a blow or fall. The jury, after a short consultation, returned a verdict of manslaughter against John Lee as principal, and Charles Chilcott and Albert Young as aiding and abetting in the fight. | 1863 | 15 July     | London          | in court                     | <i>CENTRAL CRIMINAL COURT, July 15.</i><br>OLD COURT.<br>(Before the LORD CHIEF BARON.)<br><i>John Lee, Charles Chilcote and Albert Young</i> , three good-looking young men of the gipsy tribe, surrendered to take their trial on an indictment charging them with the manslaughter of William Nicholls. The prisoners were also given in charge to the jury on the coroner’s inquisition.<br>Mr. Daly appeared for the prosecution, and the prisoners were defended by Mr. Orridge and Mr. Cooper.<br>The evidence adduced on the part of the prosecution declared that two rival tribes of gipsies were located in the vicinity of “West Ham, in the pariah of Ilford, and that a broil had arisen between them, in consequence of a quarrel which arose between the mother of the deceased and the wife of the prisoner Lee, and a fight between the two women was terminated only on the understanding that the dispute should be settled by a conflict between the male relatives of the women, namely, the prisoner Lee and the deceased Nicholls. The contest took place in the Barking marshes, and it was shown to have been a “fair stand-up fight,” in which the other prisoners, Chilcote and Young, acted as seconds, though the tribes, male and female, assisted in the general affray.<br>In cross-examination it was elicited that the deceased was a practised pugilist, and that on the occasion of a former fight with another individual, he had been cautioned by the surgeon who had been necessarily called in to attend him, that he must not attempt to fight again, or the result must be fatal. It was further proved that the prisoner was a remarkably quiet and well-disposed young man, and that the deceased had declared that he would fight from sunrise to sunset before he would give up.<br>Mr. Morris, surgeon, of West Ham, proved that he had been called upon to attend the deceased, but did not see him until three hours after his death. There were only slight bruises on the face and forehead, and blood was oozing from the left ear. On a <i>post-mortem</i> examination he had opened the head, chest, and abdomen of the deceased, and he found the viscera to be healthy, but there was a mass of extravasated blood on the brain. This extravasation, which was the immediate cause of death, might have been caused by a blow, a fall, or by excitement. The indications he saw were not sufficient, in his view, to justify the opinion that blows had been the proximate cause of death, and the surgeon would not say whether the death was occasioned by a blow or by excitement.<br>The Lord Chief Baron told the jury he was clearly of opinion that instead of the prisoners being indicted for the manslaughter they ought to have been indicted for a breach of the law in having congregated for an illegal purpose.<br>The Jury, after a moment’s consultation, returned a verdict of Not Guilty in favour of all the prisoners, who were at once discharged. | <i>The Evening Herald</i> , 16 July 1863, 7                                       |
