The body of an old gipsy, named Stanley, who was known at fairs by the title of "the Gipsy King," was found by some fishermen in the river Dart, near Totnes, Devonshire, a few days ago. An inquest has been held on the body, and, although it was stated that the deceased was in company with his sons, got intoxicated, and quarrelled with them, and threatened to drown himself, yet it now appears, according to the medical testimony, that death was caused by strangulation, and it is believed that he was murdered. Various rumours as to the appearance of deceased when found having got abroad, the coroner held an inquest, which was from time to time adjourned. The medical men ask for a post-mortem examination, giving it as their opinion that the man had been strangled before being thrown into the water. The police are already possessed of some important information, and the inquest stands again adjourned until Friday, the 14th inst. The tribe to which deceased belonged have offered a reward of 50 <i>l.</i> for the apprehension of the murderer, and it is believed by many that some of the tribe who are next in succession to the kingship have had a hand in the old king's death.	<i>The Daily News</i> , 12 November 1856, 3
1856	mid-November	Totnes, DEV	inquest held	At the inquest on the "Gipsy King of the West," the wife of the deceased stated that her husband left the van early on Tuesday morning to go to Totnes fair ; she did not accompany him, but saw him in the afternoon, when they had some drink together. He left her to go to the horse fair, and she never saw him alive again. Almost his last act was to buy a pony for his "poor old woman to ride," as he thought she was getting up in years, and needed such help in her wanderings about the country. The witness seemed frantic with grief, as she said deceased "was such a good old man to her." The ostler at the inn where deceased stopped last saw him standing in the passage in company with a "strange man," who was respectably dressed. Mr. Haines, surgeon, deposed that death had been caused by strangulation. There was a dark red band round the neck of the deceased, which had evidently been produced by the neckcloth being tightly pressed against it. His hands were clinched, and were raised as if in self-defence, and there was a heavy frown on the countenance. It was suspected that the old man had met with foul play by some of the gipsy tribe, but no evidence has been adduced tending to support that suspicion, inasmuch as he seems to have been popular among his fraternity. 1856	late-November	Totnes, DEV	additional inquest held	The adjourned inquest on old Stanley, the "Gipsy King of the West," was held at Totness [<i>sic</i>]. Some important additional evidence was adduced which clearly proves that the old man was barbarously murdered ; but the perpetrator thereof has not yet been discovered. On the night when the deceased was last seen he was observed talking to a little boy, the son of a cottager, on the bridge at Totnes about eight o'clock. While he was so engaged a tall, muscular man, dressed in a velveteen jacket, came up and called to Stanley in rough language to come with him, as he wanted to speak with him. The old man hesitated, and on the stranger's again requesting him to "come over to him" Stanley said to the little boy, "Come with me and see what he wants." The man heard this and said, "No, I want to see you alone." Stanley then went over to him, and the two men soon disappeared. On the following morning about two o'clock a woman living near the river heard angry voices and a noise like struggling and fighting. After a little time she heard a splash in the water, and on throwing up her window and looking out she saw a man whose appearance corresponded with the man whom Stanley accompanied on the previous night, and who had been described by the lad, leaning over the water's edge, apparently watching something or some person in the water. After he heard the window open he ran off and soon disappeared. It was again clearly pointed out to the jury by the medical men that the death of old Stanley was caused by strangulation and not by drowning, and the jury, after mature deliberation, returned a verdict of "Wilful murder against some person or persons unknown." 1834	26 June	Exeter, DEV	charged with vagabondage	At about four o'clock on Thursday morning, those active officers Taylor and Gingham, proceeded with seven or eight assistants, to a lane leading from Mary Pole Head to Cowley Bridge, to visit the encampment of certain gipsies, who, they learnt, from the information of one of the magistrates, had taken up their abode there. They found four tents full of swarthy inmates, all wrapp'd - as the sentimental people say - in the arms of Morpheus, and old blankets. There were two young men outside sleeping under a hedge, being covered with a solitary blanket, but no tent. The men, six in number, and one woman, were all taken into custody, but as there were a great many children in the encampment, the rest of the wives were suffered to remain with the little ones. It appeared also that they had 20 horses with them, and the farmers in that and any other neighbourhood in which they encamped were supposed to be great sufferers by their visit. 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				in his stockings ; he gave his name as Richard Stanley ; the second, who was next in age, said his name was William Stanley ; Thomas Stanley, the third ; John Stanley, the fourth ; Warnford Stanley, the fifth ; and that they were all sons of Richard Stanley. The sixth man said his name was John Cooper. The woman said her name was Sarah Stanley, the wife of Thomas. Evidence was then taken of their vagabond habits, and the whole of the men were committed to the tread-mill, for one fortnight, as idle and disorderly persons, sleeping in the open air. Old Stanley said that he had been in the army, and put in a printed bill to shew that he got his living by <i>rat-catching</i> , and that he had been <i>rat-catcher to the King</i> for 16 years : but this would not go down, as it is well known that his Majesty has never been troubled by rats. They begged very hard to be let off, but all to no purpose. They then besought the bench to let off the "ould gentleman" their father, but with equal want of success - offering to pay any amount in remuneration for the trouble they had given the officers ; but even this request was refused, and with much noisy show of grief, they departed to sigh within prison walls their misfortune in being deprived of the sweet woodlands and the comfortable roosting places. If the County magistrates are equally on the alert gipsies will soon be driven from this County.	
1834	27 June	Exeter, DEV	arrested and appeared in magistrates court	<p style="text-align: center;">CAPTURE OF A GANG OF GIPSIES.</p> <p>Great complaints having been recently made by farmers, of depredations committed upon their property, in the neighbourhood of this city, and in various parts of the county, where tribes of this wandering race have taken up their temporary abode, the Mayor and Magistrates of this city, in conjunction with the county Magistrates, resolved to take measures to rid the city and county of these itinerants, who prowl about, to the terror of farmers and others, upon whose property they levy contributions. Accordingly, information having been given that a gang of gipsies had encamped within the county of the city in the road, leading from Marypole Head to Cowley-bridge, the Mayor dispatched Taylor, one of the Serjeants-at-Mace, Gingham, and others of the police, at four o'clock yesterday morning, to the spot, where they found a strong party of gipsies encamped, consisting of men, women, and 8 or 10 children, with twenty horses. They were disturbed from their slumbers by the officers, and six men taken into custody. They gave their names as <i>Richard Stanley</i> (the father), <i>Wm. Stanley</i>, <i>Thos Stanley</i>, <i>John Stanley</i>, <i>Warnford Stanley</i>, <i>John Cooper</i>. Eighteen of their horses were also impounded, whilst straying in the highways.</p> <p>At nine o'clock they were brought before the Mayor and Mr. Alderman Sanders ; when Taylor and Gingham having been examined, the gipsies were called upon for their defence, the charge against them being, under the 5th Geo. 4, c.83, s.4 - which enacts "<i>that every person wandering about and lodging in any barn or outhouse, or in any deserted or unoccupied building, or in the open air, or under a tent, or in any cart, or waggon, not having a visible means of subsistence, and not giving a good account of himself or herself, &c., shall be deemed a rogue and vagabond, and liable to three months imprisonment and to be kept to hard labour.</i>"</p> <p>Richard Stanley, the chief of the tribe, said he had been an old soldier, and came to this neighbourhood to see his wife's friends. He got his living by the trade of rat-catching, and in proof of his belonging to that profession, handed a bill to his worship, "<i>R. Stanley, Rat Catcher to his Majesty 16 years, is arrived here, and acquaints gentlemen, farmers, and others, that he has for sale, a famous composition for destroying rats and mice, which produces instant death to these pernicious vermin, but will not prove hurtful to either dog, cat, or poultry.</i>" He assured the Bench that he would pay all expenses as to the impounding of the horses, and that the party should remove, if the Magistrates would forgive them this time, and let them depart from the neighbourhood. The other defendants also begged hard to be forgiven, and promised to leave the neighbourhood.</p> <p>The law-officer of the Court stated that they had been taken into custody by order of the Magistrates of the city, but it was also in conjunction with the County Justices, the whole body of Magistracy being determined to put a stop to their career of vagrancy and pillage, without which it was impossible so many of them could obtain a livelihood. The Magistrates thought it right to put them in possession of this fact, that they may understand that if they had escaped punishment on this occasion, they would have been immediately taken into custody by the county police as soon as they got out of the jurisdiction of Exeter.</p> <p>The Mayor, having consulted Mr. Alderman Sanders, said they were all clearly convicted as rogues and vagabonds, which rendered them amenable to three months imprisonment ; but in the hope that they would leave this neighbourhood and the county, and take to some more honest and creditable course of life, the full punishment upon the present occasion would not be awarded them, but the sentence of the Court was, that they should be committed to the House of Correction for fourteen days, and kept to hard labour.</p>	<i>The Exeter & Plymouth Gazette</i> , 28 June 1834, 3
