These Sessions commenced on Wednesday last... /

THURSDAY...

Great Creaton. - NATHAN BALDERSON and THOMAS BROWN were indicted for stealing 19s. 6d. from the person of John Palmer, at Great Creaton. Mr. Merewether was for the prosecution. - John Palmer said he is a labourer at Hollowell. He was at Creaton feast, and was in Dunkley's booth between 11 and 12, and was about to begin a dance, when Balderson offered to show money against him for 6d. Witness pulled out his purse, when Balderson tried to snatch it away from him. He did not succeed ; he (witness) keeping hold of one end of it. He told him to loose it several times, and at last he called for a policeman. At this moment Brown came up and cut the purse in two. The end which Balderson had contained the money. - Joseph Crisp was in Dunkley's booth and saw Balderson catch hold of the purse. He held it for five minutes, and then Thomas Brown cut the purse. Is sure it was he, - Elizabeth Ward went to the booth to look after her two sons, and saw Balderson have hold of the purse three or four minutes. Did not see how they were separated, but she heard Palmer say, "You give me my money." Is sure Brown was there. There were a great many persons round at the time. - Police-constable George Howes was at the booth, and Palmer told him they had got his money. For some time he was in such a rage as to be unintelligible. Witness took the prisoner into custody. Balderson admitted that he had the purse, but said he didn't know what had become of the money. Brown said he knew nothing about it. - Balderson said he was in the booth, where Palmer was kicking about over the floor. He said to him, "You don't call that dancing, do you?" upon which Palmer said, "I'll dance you for a shilling." He told him he hadn't got a shilling, and Palmer then said he could show money with him, and threw his purse at him. He caught it between his fingers, and asked whether he meant to give it to him. Palmer said if he didn't give it up he'd hit him over the nose, and challenged to fight him. At this moment somebody cut the purse, the end between his fingers slipped down, and he never saw purse or money more. - Brown declared he knew nothing of the matter except that there was a row, till he was charged with cutting the purse. - The Jury consulted together for some time, and at last found the prisoners guilty, with a recommendation to mercy on the ground of the temptation to which they had been exposed. - Mr. Merewether joined in this recommendation as far as Balderson was concerned, but as to Brown he could hardly do so, because he had persisted that he knew nothing about it. - The Court sentenced them to Three Months' Imprisonment.

NORTHAMPTON DIVISION PETTY SESSIONS.

MAGISTRATES' CHAMBER, SATURDAY LAST...

Creaton. - Threatening to Murder. - Joseph Dunn, of Creaton, was charged with having threatened to murder Elizabeth Dunkley, at Creaton, on the 21st May. Mr. C.C. Becke appeared for the defendant, who pleaded not guilty. - Complainant said the defendant came to her door at one o'clock, on the Whit Monday morning, and wished her to let him in. She refused to comply with his wish, when he swore that if she did not he would pull her and her sister, who was with her, out of the bedroom window, and murder them. They told him to go home, but he got up on the shoulders of another man who was with him and said, "Put me up at this window, and I will fetch them out and murder them." He came to the chamber window and threatened to murder them. Why he did so she did not know, for she had never done any harm to him in her life. He tried to get into the room, but her sister prevented him from getting in at the window. It wanted a quarter to two o'clock when the two men went away, so that they had been three-quarters of an hour about the house. She was afraid of the defendant, who, she feared, would do some mischief towards her. - Cross-examined by Mr. Becke : She was married to Joseph Dunkley. Her sister was not married, and it was she who had got six week's imprisonment for assaulting the sister-in-law of the defendant, with whom, however, she did not threaten to be even. She judged the man who had come to the house to be another man, but now she was sure it was the defendant Dunn. She was still afraid that he would do some harm towards her. - Zilpah Smith, who kissed the book with a hearty ingenuousness that was quite refreshing, and at first seemed to think that was all that was required of her, then gave her version of the affair. "Well, begging your pardon, sir, he come to the door and he kicked twice, and he made answer and called for my sister several times. And my sister says to me, 'Don't you make answer to them.' I asked him, 'What do you want?' and he says, 'Come down [sic].' I says, 'What business have you here this time o' night, and what should I think o' myself if I let a drunken man in like you?' And he says, 'Come down, or I'll murder you.' There was another man with him, and he got on this man's shoulders and came up against the window, and he took hold of my arm, and I thought he would have dragged me out only I pushed him away. We was almost 'frit' to death, and I could hardly keep my sister from dying." - Cross-examined by Mr. Becke : It was her sister who was married to Dunkley. - Mr. Becke : Were you not imprisoned for six weeks by this Bench for assaulting defendant's sister-in-law? - Witness (with an astonishing look of mingled horror and surprise:) Six weeks, sir! six weeks, sir! - Mr. Becke : Were you not imprisoned for that period? - Witness : That has nothing to do with the present case. - On the question being pressed the witness said it was a long time ago, not several weeks only but several months. - Mr. Becke : When that took place did you not say you would be even with them? - Witness : I never bear malice to no one. - Since Whit Monday, the day of the offence, the man had been at Creaton, and had not attempted to molest them since, but that was because he had got wind of the affair coming before the magistrates. - By the Bench : She was sure and certain the defendant would do some harm to them unless he were prevented. - Mr. Becke then addressed the Bench for the defence. - The magistrates considered the case an attempt to commit a gross assault, and they would bind the defendant over to keep the peace for six months, himself in £10 and one surety in £5.

There was another man with him, and he got on this man's shoulders and came up against the window, and he took hold of my arm, and I thought he would have dragged me out only I pushed him away. We was almost 'frit' to death, and I could hardly keep my sister from dying." - Cross-examined by Mr. Becke : It was her sister who was married to Dunkley. - Mr. Becke : Were you not imprisoned for six weeks by this Bench for assaulting defendant's sister-in-law? - Witness (with an astonishing look of mingled horror and surprise:) Six weeks, sir! six weeks, sir! - Mr. Becke : Were you not imprisoned for that period? - Witness : That has nothing to do with the present case. - On the question being pressed the witness said it was a long time ago, not several weeks only but several months. - Mr. Becke : When that took place did you not say you would be even with them? - Witness : I never bear malice to no one. - Since Whit Monday, the day of the offence, the man had been at Creaton, and had not attempted to molest them since, but that was because he had got wind of the affair coming before the magistrates. - By the Bench : She was sure and certain the defendant would do some harm to them unless he were prevented. - Mr. Becke then addressed the Bench for the defence. - The magistrates considered the case an attempt to commit a gross assault, and they would bind the defendant over to keep the peace for six months, himself in £10 and one surety in £5.	<i>The Northampton Mercury</i> , 9 June 1866, 6

Of course the marriage under the present law was a nullity, and defendant had formed an illicit relationship with a third sister, and upon the discovery of his profligacy, the applicant left him. - Defendant did not deny any of these facts, but said complainant had left him six weeks ago, and had thrown down the key, and told him she was going into the Union. He had given her a shilling every day, and nobody could live with her.
