1869	28 August	Oxford, OXF	in magistrates court	<i>Henry Darby</i> , 21, and <i>Charles George London</i> , 23, hawkers, were charged, by P.C. Fry, with hawking without a license at Nuneham, on the 20th inst. - Pleaded not guilty. - P.C. Fry, stationed at Cowley, said on Friday (yesterday) afternoon, he went in pursuit of the two prisoners, and saw them calling from door to door with crockery ware under their arms. They exchanged two plates for an old hat, and a piece of glass (produced) for a pair of old boots. When he apprehended them they said they sold for the prisoner Darby's brother who had a license. The other man (Darby) was ten or eleven yards off, standing by a truck ; he did not see any name upon it. The articles they sold were taken from the truck. - Prisoners defended themselves by saying that they were employed by Darby's brother. - The Chairman, in inflicting a fine of 10s. and costs 50s. each, said he had, believing them ignorant of the law mitigated the penalty as much as possible, and read the Act of Parliament, which said that the servants of a licensed hawker, (not being themselves licensed) may be punished for hawking his goods.
