



The complainant, Police-constable Hyatt, urged that it was only held on one day, while the defendants contended that from time immemorial it had been a two-days' fair. They produced a written statement purporting to be signed by several of the inhabitants setting forth that the fair lasted two days, but as this was not evidence the Magistrates could not act upon it Supt. Reynolds said he had made enquiries and found that many years ago vans and stalls used to stop in the village for three or four days, and sometimes for a week. Now complaints were made when the fair people stopped more that one day [<i>sic</i>]. He could find no record as to how long the fair ought to last The Magistrates dismissed the cases, the Chairman observing that if the inhabitants of Little Munden wished to abolish the fair or reduce the time in which it is held, they must take the necessary steps to do it. As a relative of the deceased had been interred in Shenley churchyard, it was decided by the friends to bury him there likewise, and the funeral took place on Monday. In spite of the rain which fell heavily, a considerable number of villagers, prompted by curiosity, assembled to witness the event. Inspectors Nutt and Gurling with several police constables were also present. Those, however, who expected to see some striking peculiarity in the proceedings were disappointed, for the funeral was conducted on ordinary lines. The funeral cortège, consisting of a hearse and mourning coach, having arrived at the church gate, and the procession formed, the Rev. H. J. Newcome reading the opening sentences of the Burial Service, led the way into the church, and the service proceeded in the usual manner. Seventeen gipsies of both sexes, and of all ages, followed the coffin; they were all clad in decent mourning, and behaved with due decorum. One or two seemed deeply affected. The coffin had a few floral wreaths on it, and inside were deposited a walking stick and small mirror. Two of the gipsies carried artificial flowers which they placed on the grave. 



1879	25 September	Cambridge, CAM	in magistrates court	On Thursday, the 18th instant, a gipsy woman, rejoicing in the unfeminine name of Leviathan Thorp (the wife of a travelling gipsy) called at the residence of Mrs. James, of Market-street, having buttons to sell. Two servant girls "answered" the door-bell, and some small articles being purchased, Leviathan asked Hannah Chapman, who, although only "sweet seventeen," holds the dignified position of cook, whether she would like to have her fortune told: Hannah thought she should, and gave her fellow servant (about the same age) "the straight tip" to leave her while Leviathan unvelied the future, for her special edification. The cook, being now at the mercy of Leviathan, the usual performance, "in that case made and provided" proceeded. Little Cookey was requested to produce a piece of gold, which she did, in the shape of a sovereign, with which she crossed the Leviathan's delicate hand: then a pack of cards was produced, representing a small planetary system, on which the gold was placed. Then followed the usual hocus-pocus business. The sovereign was placed in a piece of paper; then, apparently another piece; and finally in a third piece. Then a parcel resembling the paper, with a coin in it, was returned to the girl; but in this legerdemain the cook's goose was cooked. The Leviathan solemnly exclaimed "put the parcel under your pillow, and you will dream of a handsome young man; he will be your husband; but if you examine the parcel before the end of the week the charm will be broken. Swear that you will not open the paper till seven days have expired." Then the Leviathan administered the following oath; "I swear, so help me God, that I will not open the parcel for a week." After this, she was told that after the expiration of seven days she would find £1 10s. instead of a sovereign. Thereupon the Leviathan took her departure. Now, when Hannah Chapman informed her fellow servant, Sarah Adams, of the result of the interview, she was incredulous; and strongly urged her to open the mysterious parcel, and Hannah did	The Cambridge Independent Press, 27 September 1879, 7

On Thursday there was a crowded room to hear the case. The depositions being read, Mr. Naylor, who appeared for the prisoner, advised her to plead guilty. He stated that she had four children, and in a few months another little Leviathan might be expected. This was the first charge that had ever been brought against her, and he expressed the hope that the Bench would deal leniently with her, thereby showing a manly compassion upon her, in her situation; no injury had been done; the girl had got her sovereign back again; and if a certain amount of wickedness had been shown on the one hand; at any rate great folly had been displayed on the other. The Bench considered a long time as to whether to commit the prisoner for trial, or to deal with the case summarily; eventually it was decided to give her 6 month's hard labour.
