The complainant, Police-constable Hyatt, urged that it was only held on one day, while the defendants contended that from time immemorial it had been a two-days' fair. They produced a written statement purporting to be signed by several of the inhabitants setting forth that the fair lasted two days, but as this was not evidence the Magistrates could not act upon it Supt. Reynolds said he had made enquiries and found that many years ago vans and stalls used to stop in the village for three or four days, and sometimes for a week. Now complaints were made when the fair people stopped more that one day [sic]. He could find no record as to how long the fair ought to last The Magistrates dismissed the cases, the Chairman observing that if the inhabitants of Little Munden wished to abolish the fair or reduce the time in which it is held, they must take the necessary steps to do it.
