Music, with tambourines and triangles, and a large concourse of spectators, accompanied the party, dressed in ribbons and garlands, and really it was a very different affair to the melancholy aspect of the weddings of the more civilised community. Here was gaiety of heart, and a real display of its enjoyment. To an inquirer, who asked the younger bride whether it was true that weddings were sometimes solemnised amongst gipsies by the sportive ceremony of jumping over a crossed stick, the laughing and glowing dark-skin replied, "May be - but I was determined to be lawfully married." The ceremony was performed by the Rev. Mr. Guinniss, who checked the vivacity of the damsel; and when admonished to be serious, it was amusing to hear the simplicity of tone in which she endeavoured to excuse herself, saying, that she "surely ought not to cry!" After the affair was finished, a gay and merry party kept up the rejoicing until a late hour, and the feast, which was liberally open to all visitors, was abundant and expensive. - <i>Stamford News</i> . They were at Leighton fair on the 1st of May, and the youth retired to rest in the presence of his father, about half-past nine, putting off the clothes the subject of the indictment, the knife being in one of the pockets. The boy put the clothes under his pillow, and his father left, and on his return in about an hour he found a hole cut in the tilt, near the boy's head. He looked over his goods, but missed none, and he went to sleep. The next morning, about six o'clock, the clothes were missed. The evidence to connect the prisoner with the abstraction was that he took a bundle to a beerhouse about ten o'clock on the night of the robbery, and asked for a basket he had left there in the day time. He then put the bundle in, and said to the landlady, "take particular care of this ; they are my wife's things, and you know what belongs to a woman." He then went out, and the landlady, with the curiosity proverbial of the sex, and which was aroused by the prisoner's strict injunction, looked into the bundle, and saw the clothes, which the prisoner fetched away about twelve at night, but afterwards took back, and the landlady then called a neighbour into council, and they examined the clothes; the knife fell out, and the landlady kept it for the purpose of identification. Gray finally took the clothes and the basket away about four in the morning, and the former have not been seen since. About seven in the morning, Mrs. Croft (the landlady) found an owner for the knife in the person of Lofts, who with his son now swore to it. <i>Guilty</i> . A previous conviction having been proved, prisoner was sentenced to 6 calendar months' imprisonment. The prisoner is a gipsy; and the sympathy existing among the tribe for any member of their body when "in trouble" was evinced on this occasion by their attendance in large numbers, both within and without the Court. It was stated that the health of the prisoner is in a very precarious state, which accounts for the absence of a sentence to hard labour. Being asked for the money, he denied that he had got it, but the prosecutor saw it in his hand after the denial. Eliza Silvers, of Rickinghall, John Scott, of Colchester, who keeps a stall in the fair, and Betsey Parker, of the Brackland, all deposed to seeing Gray take the money ; and the latter two saw Gray's hand go to the hand of a man named Parfrey, as if passing something to him. 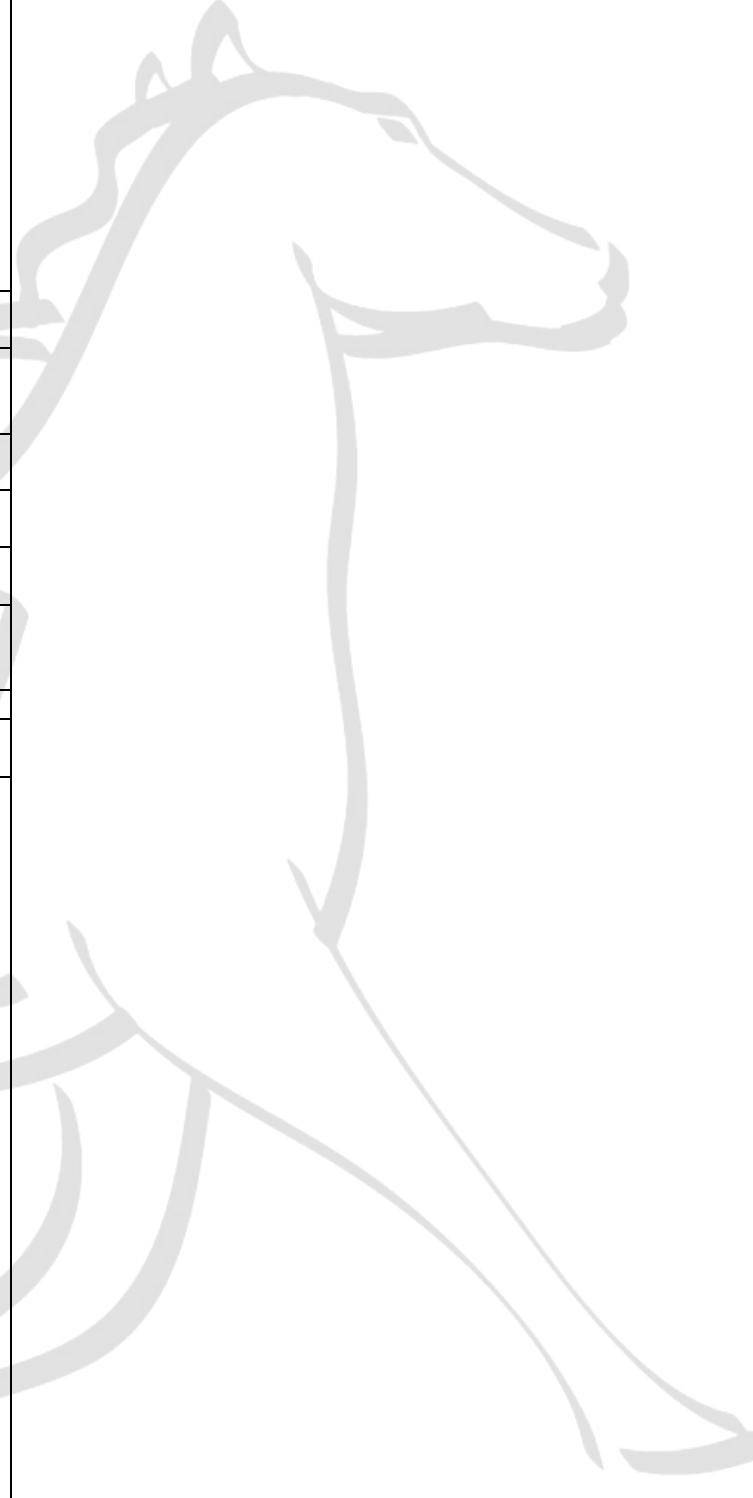

The defendant pleaded guilty, and Mr. Belk addressed the Bench with the view to the infliction of the lowest fine which could be awarded by that court; and he hoped that the magistrates would recommend the Commissioners to further reduce the fine to a small sum. This they appeared to be disposed to do, when Mr. Southgate stated that it was quite open for them to make such a recommendation, but he must tell them that, though he would be happy to convey to the Commissioners any expression of the Bench on the subject, he felt he could not support such a recommendation. Had the evidence been gone into, it would have disclosed some very aggravated features; and he considered the defendant most fortunate in having been so well advised by Mr. Belk.
