A short time since the police received orders when they found any of them camping in lanes, &c., to pass this lawless gang from one to another until they had passed them out of the county. On Thursday night week about 30 of the above gang were found encamping near the "Chequer House," about four miles from Retford, and adjoining Mr. Holmes farm, where several potatoe pies had most likely been attracting their attention. Mr. Holmes not liking the looks of so formidable a gang so near his "pies," set a man of the name of Merrils to watch their movements, and about midnight one of the gang came to the "pies" and began to help himself, taking [sic] away with him several pecks. In formation was forwarded to Retford, and superintendant Martin with two constables repaired to the "encampment" and apprehended all the men and conveyed them to the police station at Retford. On Saturday last they were brought before the magistrates in petty sessions, when they gave their names as Elijah Bosw ll [sic], William Boswell, James Boswell, and Elijah Boswell, jun. Several of the leading farmers from off the forest were in attendance, and gave evidence of the annoyance they were subjected to by the prisoners now in custody, who had been camping about them at various times for years. W. Boswell was committed for trial at the ensuing sessions for stealing the potatoes, and the evidence not being so clear against the other three, they were committed to the House of Correction at Southwell for a month each, as rogues and vagabonds. Such effective measures as these will soon put a stop to these wandering and almost lawless vagabonds.</p> <p>A ROYAL FAMILY. - There is in the county of Nottingham an extensive tribe of gipsies, headed by Elijah Boswell, who is styled the Gipsy King, a distinction which he is said to have lineally inherited from a long line of ancestors. Four of the tribe - viz., Elijah and three of his sons - got "into trouble" last week on account of some little matter of meum, and tuum, and were brought before the Retford bench of magistrates on Saturday, on a charge of felony, which ended in Elijah and two of his sons being sent to the treadmill for a month, and the other son being committed for trial. The Gipsy King has been married three times, and the following enumeration of his family is supplied from his own archives : - 1. Eliza, born among the ling in Mansfield forest ; 2. 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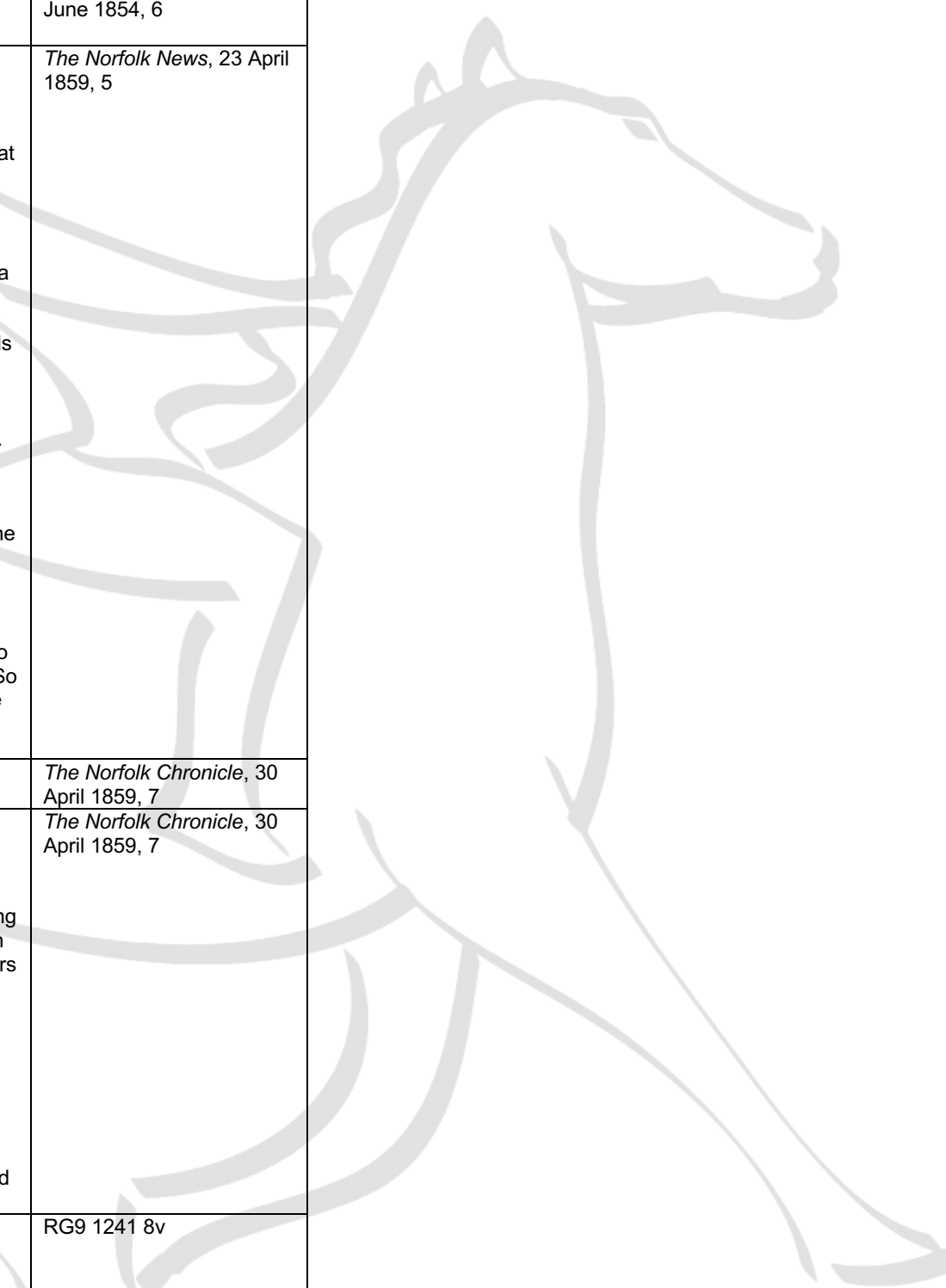

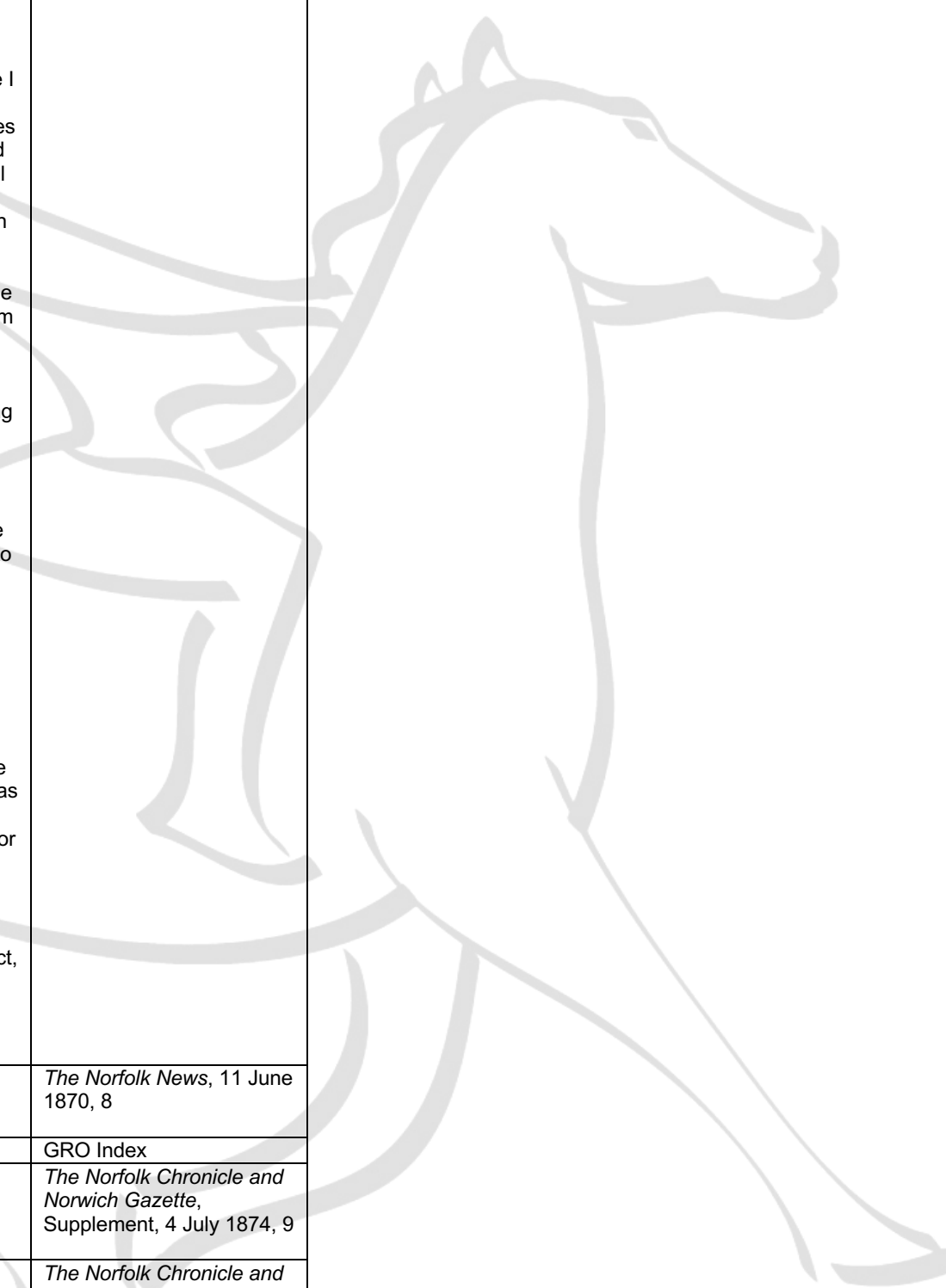

The fact of its falling unusually late this year, gave the sheep an extra two months to improve; and we saw no falling off of these animals either as to quantity or quality - indeed we heard of a pen of hoggets which made upwards of 60s. Such high prices, as a matter of course, produced a comparative dullness, but the great quantity of mangolds on hand, and the abundance of grass in the pastures, made dealers hold firm to their demands. The total number of sheep penned was 23,000.</p> <p>The show of bullocks was not more than a usual market average, and sold at high prices.</p> <p>The horse-fair is now almost absorbed by Spelman's repository, in which there were a large number of entries and a numerous attendance of purchasers.</p> <p>We cannot close our remarks without throwing out a suggestion to the farmers and dealers, that the time is come for the discontinuance of this fair. Time was - when roads were bad - that people seldom visited the metropolis of the county ; but now the railways bring in their thousands in a few hours from the most remote parts, and business can easily be conducted in a quiet and regular manner at the ordinary Saturday markets; whereas the present fair spoils two Saturdays to make one fair day. These remarks apply to Lynn as well; and we know of no reason why the fairs should not be abolished, except that there is too great a disposition to adhere to old customs, however unwise and unnecessary.</p> <p>In the pleasure fair, there was the usual <i>quantum</i> of amusements in all varieties for the benefit of those to whom care, in its strict sense, is as yet unknown. Here, in fact, "all went merry as a marriage bell;" and although youngsters get the credit of being the principal patrons of this department, the attractions which it presented, in the shape of penny theatres, miniature menageries, <i>petit</i> shooting galleries, &c., proved quite sufficient to draw together enormous crowds of "children" of larger growth, belonging to both sexes, who had evidently made up their minds for at least one day's enjoyment. So far as we have heard, everything passed off agreeably, and the day closed without the occurrence of a single incident calculated to disturb the pleasantness for which the season is generally looked forward to as an occasion of mirth and profit.</p>	<i>The Norfolk News</i> , 23 April 1859, 5

1859	25 April	Norwich, NFK	in magistrates court	A GIPSY IN TROUBLE. - <i>Louis Gray</i> , a gipsy, was charged with doing wilful damage in the White Horse, public house, Castle-meadow, kept by Mr. Lacey, and also with assaulting the police. The defendant and a numerous party of his fraternity had been attracted to this city by the fair, and on Saturday afternoon they went into Mr. Lacey's house, when the defendant commenced tossing the mugs and pots about, and breaking the glasses. He also struck the ceiling with the crome of his whip making large holes in it, and doing considerable damage. He was so violent and annoyed the other customers so much that the landlord, having, when he expostulated with the defendant, been thrown roughly on a chair, sent for the police. Sergeant Heyhoe and police-constable Fuller went, and the landlord gave the defendant in charge, but he swore that ten men could not take him, and when Fuller seized him he struck him a violent blow with his whip-stock, intended for the head, but which Fuller received on his hand which he raised for protection ; one of the finger-nails was split and the fingers much bruised. Sergeant Heyhoe took the whip from him, and with the aid of six or seven policemen conveyed him to the station-house. - Defendant expressed his regret for what he had done. 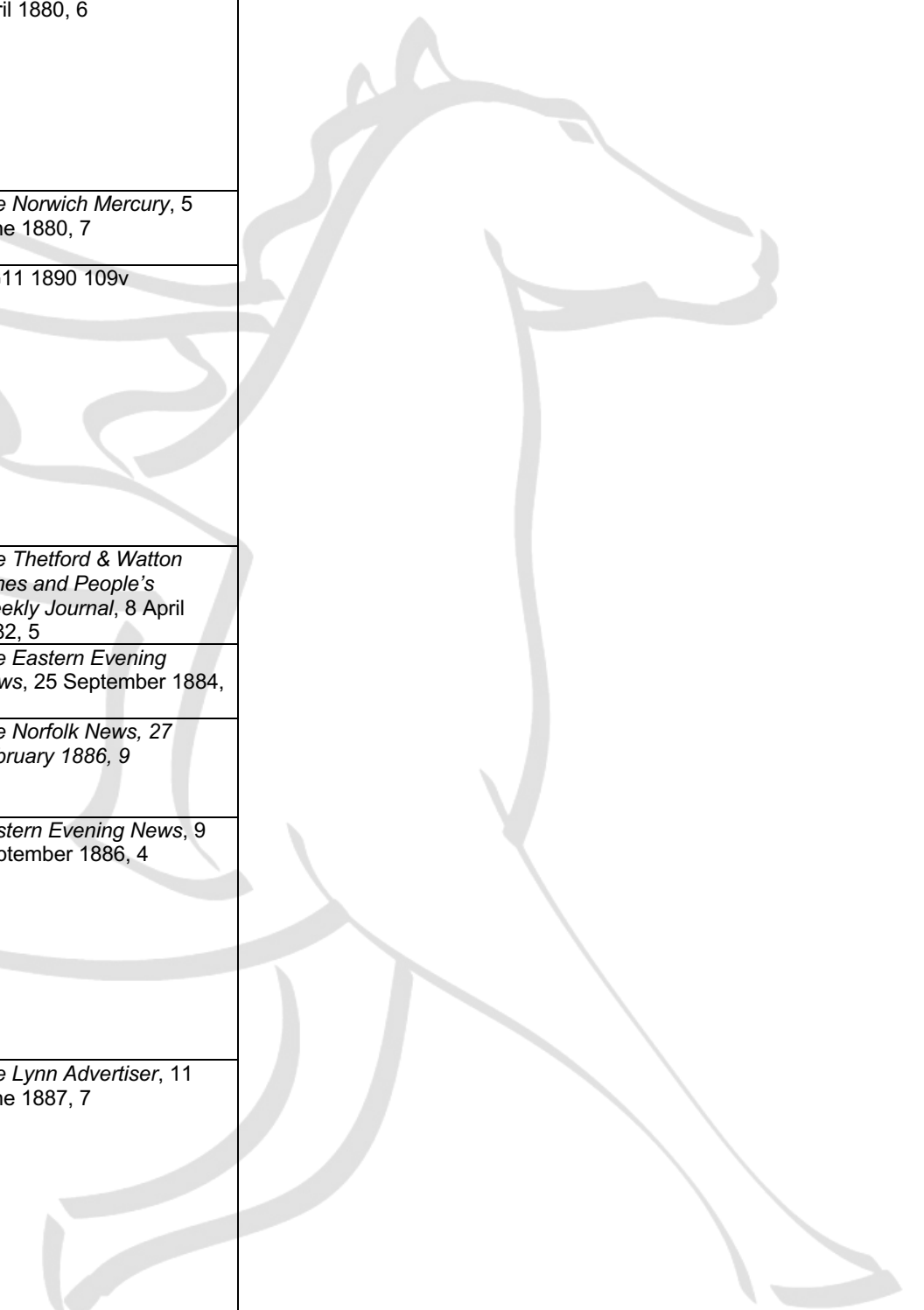

He asked me to buy a set of harness. I asked him what he wanted for it, and he said 15s. I gave him 12s for it. Gray's own conduct in buying for 12s 6d a set of harness worth 3l, and then taking it away 50 or 60 miles and selling it for 27s 6d, was an indication of his knowledge that he was dealing with stolen property, and it was not uncharitable to infer that he himself might have been the person who stole the harness from the stable. In fact, if Gray's evidence was correct, he ought to have been in the dock with the prisoner, for there never was a case which would have established more strongly a charge of receiving stolen property. The whole case, in fact, rested exclusively on the evidence of Gray, and the jury would judge whether this was at all worthy of credence.</p> <p>The RECORDER summed up against the prisoner and the jury, after a short consultation, stated that they found him <i>not guilty</i> "for want of sufficient evidence."</p>

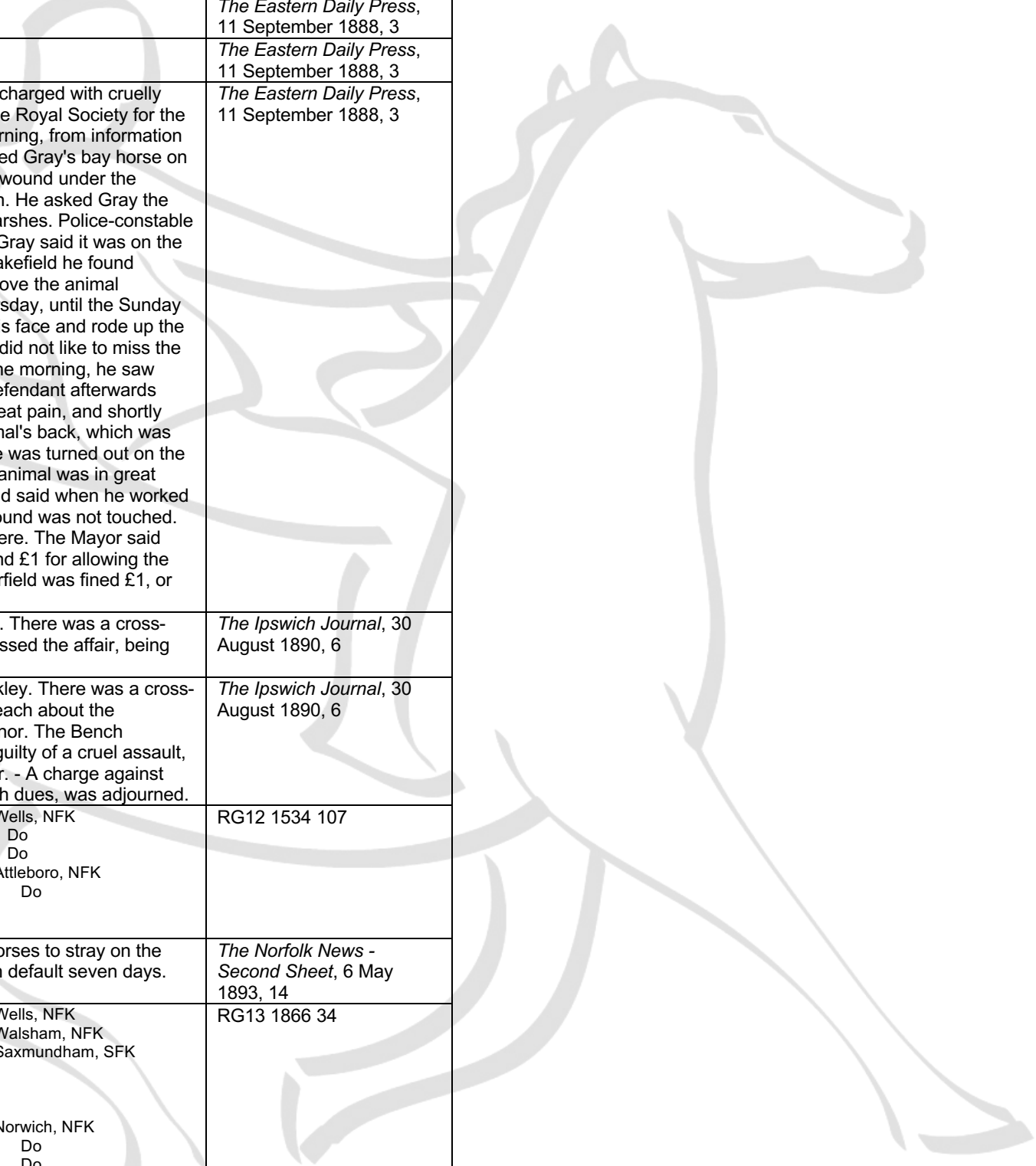

Briefly, the plaintiff's case was that during four days in which the defendant had the horse on liking with a view to purchase, the animal sustained a broken knee ; that he would have settled with him at the time for a sovereign, but the defendant offered only a crown ; and that he estimated the injury done at 3 <i>l.</i> , with 2 <i>l.</i> for the loss of time caused by treating with the defendant for the sale of the horse. Witness asked him if he drove the animal mentioned, and he said he used it from the Regatta day on Thursday, until the Sunday following. He gave it up to Gray, who put the saddle on before his face and rode up the Beach. He said he used the horse because it was lame, and he did not like to miss the Regatta day. Police-constable Stewart said on Monday last, in the morning, he saw defendant riding a horse to the tank on the Royal Hotel Plain. Defendant afterwards turned to the Beach, and rode it there. The animal seemed in great pain, and shortly after witness saw Inspector Ford. There was a place on the animal's back, which was very sore. He denied the statement made by Gray that the horse was turned out on the marshes, having seen it in Chipperfield's cab for four days. The animal was in great pain, and it was decidedly cruel to work it. Defendant Chipperfield said when he worked the horse he had the saddle padded on each side so that the wound was not touched. He knew the wound was there, and therefore put the padding there. The Mayor said they convicted Gray, and he was fined £1 for the first offence, and £1 for allowing the horse to be used ; in default, fourteen days' hard labour. He was fetched to deceased about eight o'clock that morning, when he found him quite dead, and to the best of his belief death was caused by apoplexy. There was a good deal of discolouration on the left side of the face. - By the Jury. - The discolouration was caused by the return of the blood, and was one of the effects of apoplexy. - The Coroner, in summing up, said the evidence was startling in its conciseness. 1839	5 June	Welney, NFK		<p><i>Loss of Life.</i> - On Wednesday se'nnight, a well-looking gipsy-girl of about 17 years of age, named Grey, a boy about 5, her brother, and two other boys, her cousins, also named Grey, left their tents in company with another urchin, and proceeded to the river side, near the suspension bridge, in the parish of Welney, in the Isle of Ely. The four first named, jumped into a boat which was fastened to the shore by a chain, which the latter no sooner observed than he let it loose, and shoved it off. The poor girl attempted to jump on shore with her brother in her arms, but fell into the river : the two boys, aged eight and ten, followed her example, and also fell in. The tide was running remarkably strong at the time, and the whole were carried rapidly down the stream. The youngster, seeing the miichief he had occasioned, immediately ran to the tent and gave the alarm, when one the gang, (the only one who could swim,) ran to the river, plunged in, and succeeded by great exertions in rescuing the two biggest boys from a watery grave ; the children clung to him with such pertinacity, that they had nearly drowned him as well as themselves, and he was completely exhausted when he got to land. The poor fellow's feelings can be better imagined than described, when he found the two children he had saved were <i>his own sons</i> ! which he was ignorant of until he had brought them ashore. The girl and child were drowned. Several people have been employed ever since, to drag the river for the bodies, and on Tuesday last, six days afterwards, the body of the child was discovered by a waterman, but that of the girl, up to Thursday last, had not been found. A coroner's jury sat upon the body on Wednesday last, and a verdict was returned, of "Accidentally drowned." The same evening the poor boy was buried in Welney church-yard, and his funeral was attended by a large concourse of spectators and gypsies from their tents, whose woe-stricken countenances plainly indicated that a want of affection is not engendered by their predatory and rambling manner of life.</p> <p>Upon a day, many years ago, the children of Pirusus were boating on a river, and, their craft capsizing, all were flung into the stream. Prisoners pleaded not guilty. - Mr. Dyer prosecuted : Mr. Bean appeared for Samuel Gray, and Mr. Cranch, of Nottingham, appeared for Abraham. - The case occupied the Court a considerable time, but the facts of the case were as follows : - On the 1st of December prisoners went to prosecutor's premises and said they had been sent by their brother, Thomas Gray, of Heckington, to purchase a filly, which they did for £40, giving 10s. out for luck. £1 was paid on account and the remainder was to be paid on the 6th December at Boston, but the prisoners failed to pay the remainder. The prosecutor then saw Thomas Gray, of Heckington, who told him that the prisoners had no authority from him to buy his horse. Warrants were then taken out for the apprehension of the prisoners, and Abraham was taken at Beverley Fair, and Samuel surrendered. P.C. Rutherford, 227 R, said the previous Wednesday, he was on duty in New-road, Woolwich, and was called by the husband, who said the prisoner had attempted to commit suicide. He went to the house and obtained medical assistance. Dr. Macdonnell, of New-road, Woolwich, administered an emetic. He produced a bottle, labelled <i>aqua fortis</i> (nitric acid), purchased at Worsley's, chemist, New-road. At this stage of the proceedings, the prisoner's daughter, a little girl of about nine years, who had been listening in deep distress to the evidence in the part of the court allotted to the public, entered the dock and began comforting and soothing her mother with great affection. They both burst into tears, and neither the magistrate nor gaoler had the heart to turn her out. The mother looked very pale and ill, and was allowed to sit down. The husband was then called, and appeared with a silver conduct medal for long service and good conduct. He said hee was a pensioner and travelling cutler, and complained that his wife on one occasion went away for eight months, and left him with six children. Mr. Balguy asked the prisoner why she attempted suicide. In a low whisper, which had to be interpreted and repeated by Inspector Howlett, she said that her husband was cruel to her, called her obscene names in the presence of her children, and falsely accused her of adultery. Mrs. Smith, a friend and neighbour of the prisoner, said that the husband was habitually cruel and unkind to his wife. She (witness) did not believe the charge of adultery for a moment. She went away because he led her such a wretched life. He was "jawing" her from morning till night, and her life was almost unendurable. Gray said he took all his earnings to her. Mr. Balguy : Do you take a good temper home? The magistrate then directed the prisoner to be taken back to the Infirmary, saying she looked very weak and ill, and was certainly not in a fit state to go and live with her husband again. Gray said she wanted a separation, and he was willing to pay her an allowance. The prisoner was then removed ; her little girl looked enquiringly up to ascertain if they were going to be parted, and instinctively clung to her mother. To avoid "a scene," she was allowed to go out of court with her, and was willing to go into the police cell with her ; but the police, whilst admiring her devotion and affection, gently kept her back, and consulted what was best to be done. 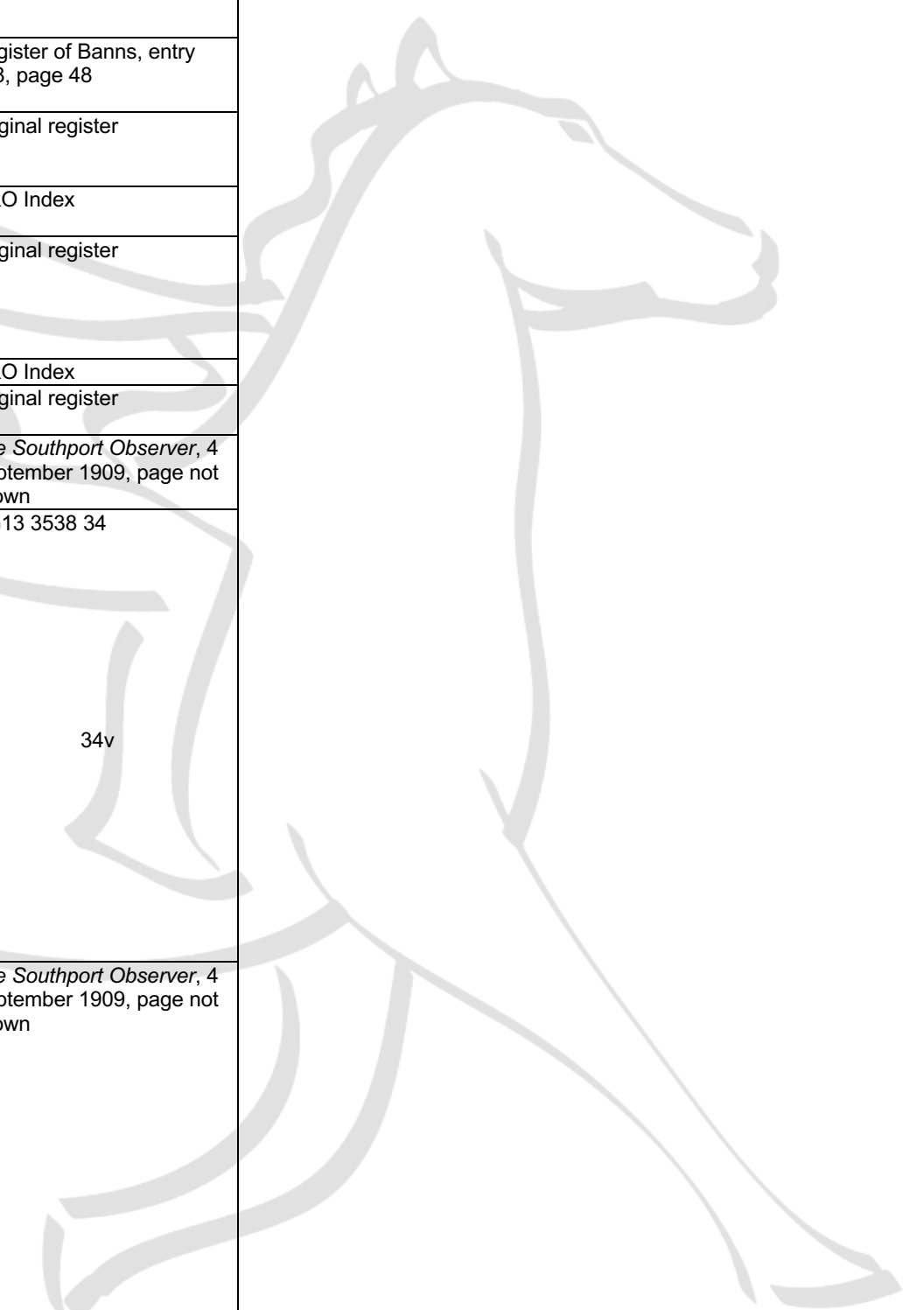

He is passionately fond of music, and to-day he cherishes a violin dated 1680, and on which he has played the music for scores of balls in the old days. He also takes pride in the possession of a real Magina that is very valuable. Mr. and Mrs. Gray have had a large family - 13 sons and one daughter. Of these, only four sons remain. They are - Enoch, John, Samson, and Joshua. All are married with the exception of John, and all stay near the parental "roof." Joshua is the only member of the family who has taken to living in a modern house. This he did to oblige his wife, who is not of gipsy extraction. But he resides only a few yards away from his father's tent, in a house in Chatham-road. In this connection Mr. Enoch explained that, contrary to the popular notion, gipsies now more generally than formerly allied themselves to helpmates outside the clan. He volunteered to prophesy that a hundred years hence there will be no true gipsies. He and his two brothers had married out of their creed, but two of the brides preferred tent life. Both Mr. Gray and his son assured our representative that neither of them had ever suffered a day's illness. Enoch, who is now 49 years of age, has not even had a toothache, and he declares that he would not change his present mode of life for the millions of Vanderbilt. Prosecutor is a cottager nearly 70 years of age, residing at Holme. On the 21st he came to Newark Market, and about 12 o'clock went into the Queen's Head with his wife to have a glass of ale. He seated himself by the side of the smoke room fire and gave his wife a sovereign to pay for the ale he had ordered. While she went for change he placed his purse containing the three sovereigns in gold on his knee. No one was near him the company in the room being nearly all at the bagatelle board. Knowing that no one but the prisoner had been near him he at once went in search of him, and met him coming from the stairs which led to the lodging room which he occupied on Tuesday night. He charged him with the robbery, and prisoner threatened to strike him if he repeated the charge, at the same time giving him liberty to search him if he thought proper. Police Constable Street was sent for and took prisoner into custody. Only 12s. 7d. was found upon him when searched. - Mr. Wm. Smedley, of Southwell, brother of the landlady, happened to call just as the circumstance occurred, and he, being amazed that a robbery should take place in the house, searched the room which the prisoner occupied the previous night, taking up the carpets and looking in every place where the money could have been secreted. At last he found three sovereigns wrapped in a bit of brown paper, hidden on the ledge behind a hat peg at the back of one of the beds - about the last place any one would have expected to find anything. He handed them over to the superintendent of police and sealed them so tight he might be able to know the parcel again. Mr. Ashby appeared with the prisoner, but the evidence was so clear that it was impossible to rebut it in any way. The prisoner pleaded guilty and begged for mercy for the sake of his wife and family at Norwich. He was one of a party of musicians, passing through the town. Defendant said he knew the horse was "quidder" and had had a tooth knocked out. It was six years old, and was resold at Donington for £36 13s. It was a very bad "quidder," which meant it could not eat hard food. - By Mr. Toynbee: He had bought horses "for life," which meant that he took them with all their faults and failings, and had no further claim upon the seller. He certainly did not buy this horse "for life." - James Maltby, Lincoln, stated that he heard defendant say he knew the horse was a "cudder" before he sold it. - Daniel Wyer, veterinary surgeon, Falkingham, stated he examined the horse in August last and found it blind in the off eye. The "quidding" was due to bad teeth of long standing, and was incurable. Most of the molar teeth were affected, and the horse could only be fed on soft boiled food. Plaintiff could not have detected this. - Wm. Hackett, veterinary surgeon, Donington, corroborated. - Mr. Toynbee contended that his client had not concealed anything, and that Gray bought the horse entirely on his own judgment, or "for life." - Defendant said he never told Gray the horse was sound. It could eat corn and chopped food; and, in answer to Mr. Trotter, he said he knew it could not eat long fodder for a year or more.
