Lewis Lewis and P.C. Tears. The gypsies had pitched their tents in a field near Durham. On Saturday forenoon P.C.s Lewis Lewis and Tears found the men of the tribe engaged on the highway in a large gambling "school," pitch and toss and cards being in full swing. The officers demanded their names, but whilst doing so P.C. Tears was felled to the ground by Harris Gray, who struck him behind the head with an iron bar, and at the same time Edward Young stabbed him in the arm with a large clasp knife, which penetrated through his clothes, but just grazed the skin. The other men then commenced to kick the prostrate constable, and Lewis had considerable difficulty in forcing his way to him. Eventually both officers got away, after P.C. Lewis had also been knocked down, and, returning to the camp with reinforcements, they apprehended the prisoners. The Bench sent Wm. It appears that as Mr. Swallow, of Chapel Farm, near Barton, was driving homewards in his dog cart, when approaching the cemetery he met a velocipede, and his horse, being rather a spirity one, shied, and gallopped suddenly round on to the embankment, throwing Mr. Swallow out, but fortunately with only a severe shaking. The horse gallopped heedlessly on through the toll-bar, and into the midst of the horse fair, knocking down several people, and ran into the back of the deceased, who completely turned a somersault, and becoming entangled in the reins was dragged along the road a few yards, whereby his skull was fractured and a blood vessel ruptured, and he died about an hour afterwards, at the White Horse, where he had been carried. Every possible effort was made to save his life by Messrs. Paterson and Son. Mr. Swallow was soon on the spot, and very kindly ordered that no expense should be spared to alleviate the sufferings of the poor unfortunate man. An inquest was held on the body on the following day, before T. 

The particulars of this case were unusually atrocious. The two women, mother and daughter, were engaged in selling wood-ware about the country, and on the 6th May called in at the Durham Ox, a public-house at Somersham. They there saw the prisoner Watson, to whom they sold some goods, and he afterwards gave them a soveriegn for all they had. Watson aftrwards made a boast of the brutality, and called the attention of others to the condition of the women. It appears that as Mr. Swallow, of Chapel Farm, near Barton, was driving homewards in his dog cart, when approaching the cemetery he met a velocipede, and his horse, being rather a spirity one, shied, and gallopped suddenly round on to the embankment, throwing Mr. Swallow out, but fortunately with only a severe shaking. The horse gallopped heedlessly on through the toll-bar, and into the midst of the horse fair, knocking down several people, and ran into the back of the deceased, who completely turned a somersault, and becoming entangled in the reins was dragged along the road a few yards, whereby his skull was fractured and a blood vessel ruptured, and he died about an hour afterwards, at the White Horse, where he had been carried. Every possible effort was made to save his life by Messrs. Paterson and Son. Mr. Swallow was soon on the spot, and very kindly ordered that no expense should be spared to alleviate the sufferings of the poor unfortunate man. 




