It appears that as Mr. Swallow, of Chapel Farm, near Barton, was driving homewards in his dog cart, when approaching the cemetery he met a velocipede, and his horse, being rather a spirity one, shied, and gallopped suddenly round on to the embankment, throwing Mr. Swallow out, but fortunately with only a severe shaking. The horse gallopped heedlessly on through the toll-bar, and into the midst of the horse fair, knocking down several people, and ran into the back of the deceased, who completely turned a somersault, and becoming entangled in the reins was dragged along the road a few yards, whereby his skull was fractured and a blood vessel ruptured, and he died about an hour afterwards, at the White Horse, where he had been carried. Every possible effort was made to save his life by Messrs. Paterson and Son. Mr. Swallow was soon on the spot, and very kindly ordered that no expense should be spared to alleviate the sufferings of the poor unfortunate man. An inquest was held on the body on the following day, before T. He is passionately fond of music, and to-day he cherishes a violin dated 1680, and on which he has played the music for scores of balls in the old days. He also takes pride in the possession of a real Magina that is very valuable. Mr. and Mrs. Gray have had a large family - 13 sons and one daughter. Of these, only four sons remain. They are - Enoch, John, Samson, and Joshua. All are married with the exception of John, and all stay near the parental "roof." Joshua is the only member of the family who has taken to living in a modern house. This he did to oblige his wife, who is not of gipsy extraction. But he resides only a few yards away from his father's tent, in a house in Chatham-road. In this connection Mr. Enoch explained that, contrary to the popular notion, gipsies now more generally than formerly allied themselves to helpmates outside the clan. He volunteered to prophesy that a hundred years hence there will be no true gipsies. He and his two brothers had married out of their creed, but two of the brides preferred tent life. Both Mr. Gray and his son assured our representative that neither of them had ever suffered a day's illness. Enoch, who is now 49 years of age, has not even had a toothache, and he declares that he would not change his present mode of life for the millions of Vanderbilt. Mr. Gray is similarly healthy, and there seems every prospect that the partnership entered into at St. James's Church fifty years ago will be continued for many years to come.	at

Prisoner was not a householder at Shipdham, and to the best of witness's belief he had never lived in a house there. Cross-examined : I believe a travelling van was there in February belonging to a man named Herbert Tann, I suppose a person who lives in a van calls it their house. On the Wednesday before the fair Frederick Gray and his son, Henry Gray, found the site they usually occupied was in Harris's possession. Harris had been known to the prosecutors for some years. Occasionally he had gone with shows and the Grays had helped him. The elder Gray, knowing he had no legal claim to the site, negotiated with Harris, asking how much he would let him have the ground for. On the Friday, the first day of the fair, they had not yet come to an agreement, and on the afternoon of that day Harris shot the Grays with a revolver, and was at once arrested. Frederick Gray, whose right arm was in a sling, was allowed to sit in front of the witness box. Describing the negotiations for the ground, he stated there was no heated feeling between them. On the Thursday night he was under the impression that the bargain was settled, and that Harris had agreed to accept £6 and a use of a portion of the ground. Accordingly, he gave instructions for his roundabouts to be erected early on Friday morning, but on getting to the ground found that this had not been done, and that Harris was still in possession. Harris then said he would not take less than £8. The witness remarked: "Then I've done with it," and walked away. About mid-day Harris met him again and asked what he was going to do. He stated: "I've finished," and Harris metrote: "I haven't finished with you." Seeing that the man was trying to cause a row, the witness walked away. Harris followed, but said nothing more, and continued watching the witness and those with him. Between 1.30 and 2 o'clock, the witness continued, as he and his son were walking round the ground, Harris ran in front of them and without a word pointed a revolver at them from a distance of eight or nine paces, and fired several shots. The witness felt the shot in the chest, and saw his son fall. Recovering themselves, the witness felt the struck Harris, and jumped on him, and they fell to the ground.
