1909	probably late August	Southport, LAN	interviewed by a newspaper reporter	[3 vans rear of 67 [Boundary St]] Mr. Gray, besides being an ex-prize-fighter, has always been keen on sport of any kind, and he recalls the fact that when 60 years of age he won a running handicap of 120 yards against eight competitors at Ormskirk. He is passionately fond of music, and to-day he cherishes a violin dated 1680, and on which he has played the music for scores of balls in the old days. He also takes pride in the possession of a real Magina that is very valuable. Mr. and Mrs. Gray have had a large family - 13 sons and one daughter. Of these, only four sons remain. They are - Enoch, John, Samson, and Joshua. All are married with the exception of John, and all stay near the parental "roof." Joshua is the only member of the family who has taken to living in a modern house. This he did to oblige his wife, who is not of gipsy extraction. But he resides only a few yards away from his father's tent, in a house in Chatham-road. In this connection Mr. Enoch explained that, contrary to the popular notion, gipsies now more generally than formerly allied themselves to helpmates outside the clan. He volunteered to prophesy that a hundred years hence there will be no true gipsies. He and his two brothers had married out of their creed, but two of the brides preferred tent life. Both Mr. Gray and his son assured our representative that neither of them had ever suffered a day's illness. Enoch, who is now 49 years of age, has not even had a toothache, and he declares that he would not change his present mode of life for the millions of Vanderbilt. Mr. Gray is similarly healthy, and there seems every prospect that the partnership entered into at St. James's Church fifty years ago will be continued for many years to come.	<i>The Southport Observer</i> , 4 September 1909, page not known

Mr. Swallow was soon on the spot, and very kindly ordered that no expense should be spared to alleviate the sufferings of the poor unfortunate man. An inquest was held on the body on the following day, before T. 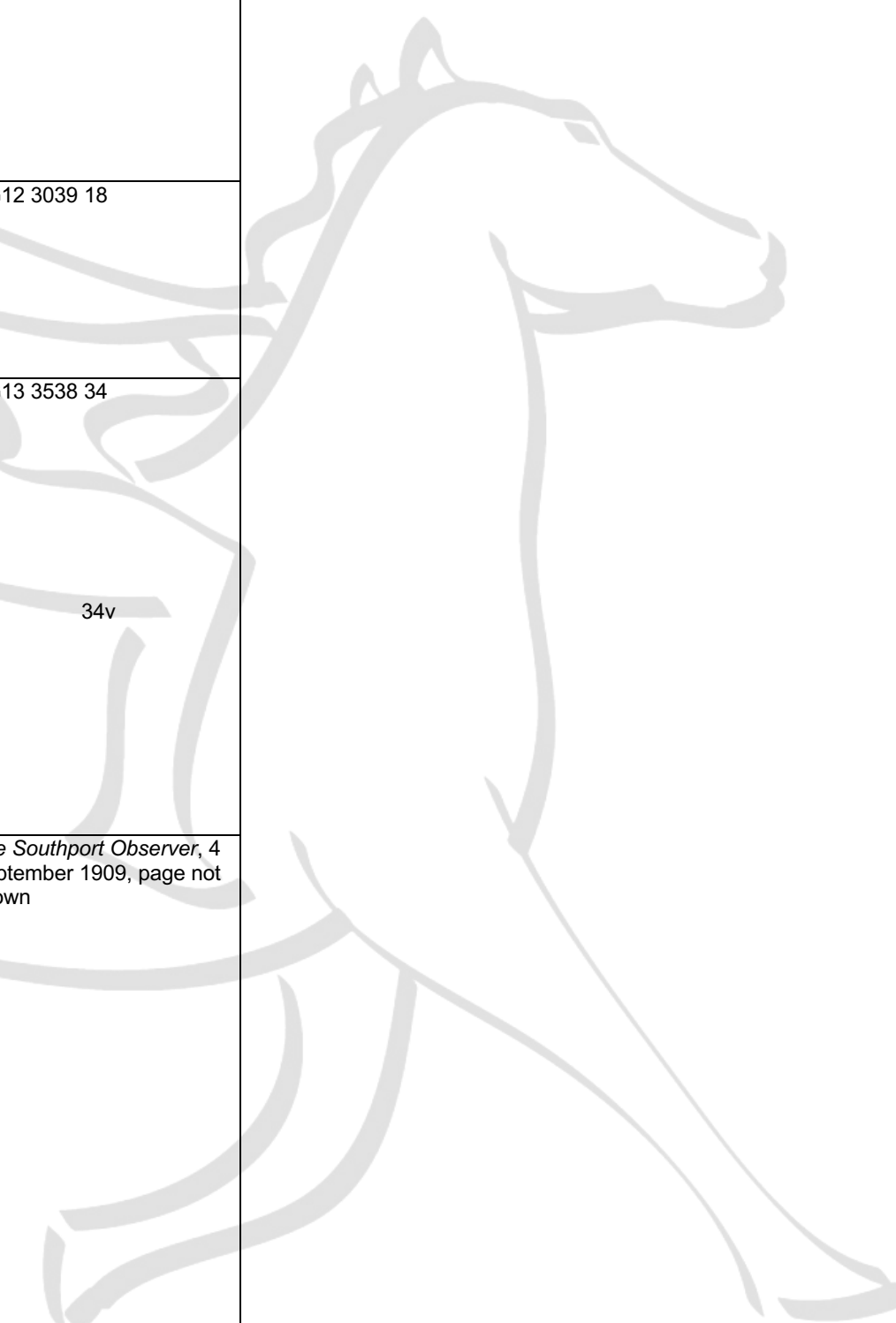

He is passionately fond of music, and to-day he cherishes a violin dated 1680, and on which he has played the music for scores of balls in the old days. He also takes pride in the possession of a real Magina that is very valuable.</p> <p>Mr. and Mrs. Gray have had a large family - 13 sons and one daughter. Of these, only four sons remain. They are - Enoch, John, Samson, and Joshua. All are married with the exception of John, and all stay near the parental "roof." Joshua is the only member of the family who has taken to living in a modern house. This he did to oblige his wife, who is not of gipsy extraction. But he resides only a few yards away from his father's tent, in a house in Chatham-road.</p> <p>In this connection Mr. Enoch explained that, contrary to the popular notion, gipsies now more generally than formerly allied themselves to helpmates outside the clan. He volunteered to prophesy that a hundred years hence there will be no true gipsies. He and his two brothers had married out of their creed, but two of the brides preferred tent life.</p> <p>Both Mr. Gray and his son assured our representative that neither of them had ever suffered a day's illness. Enoch, who is now 49 years of age, has not even had a toothache, and he declares that he would not change his present mode of life for the millions of Vanderbilt. Sayer, and J. L. Clemence, Esqs. An affray had arisen in the bar of the Crown Tap, Crown Street, between the gipsy and a man named Robert William Hunt, formerly a member of the Metropolitan Police. During the scuffle it was alleged that the gipsy took out his knife and thrust it into the complainant's hand. In this case Mr. E. A. Bracey (Messrs. Sadd & Llnay) appeared for the prosecutor, and Mr. J. A. H. Ferrier for the defence.</p> <p>William Robert Hunt said that he was recently a plain clothes officer in the Metropolitan Police, and he retired in consequence of injuries received while performing his duty. He was at present staying with his father at Prime's Road. On Thursday last, about five o'clock, he was in the Crown Tap. He was courting the barmaid. He saw the defendant come in about this time with two of his brothers, a sister, and a brother-in-law. This defendant made some remark about the ring (fawney) he had on his finger, and said "That's the bloke with the fawney on his finger who had mother chucked out." Witness made no reply to that. After that Gus made some remark, and, tearing off his collar, he approached witness and said he would tear his collar off. Witness said he would not allow any man to do that. He got up to defend himself, and defendant's brother came and struck him on the eye. He then closed with the man, who struck him, and the third brother struck him a blow on the left ear. Then this defendant approached him with the knife partially concealed, and pointed it to his face. He put up his hand to prevent him from stabbing him in the face, and received a cut in the hand. Then a woman at the bar threw a jug at him, and hit this defendant on the head. During this time witness cleared out through the door into the yard. All five followed him into the yard, and somebody shouted "Let's do for him." Thomas Ransome was in the bar all the time of the disturbance, also a man named Hewes was in the bar during the disturbance.</p> <p>Cross-examined by Mr. Ferrier - It was about three o'clock when he first entered the bar. He left the public-house a minute after. He went again about 3-30 or 3-45 p.m. He could not swear what time the defendant came in, but he thought it would be between three and four o'clock. He had a glass of beer to drink a few minutes after he entered, and during the afternoon he had about three glasses of ale to drink. One he paid for. He treated a gentleman with a cigar. It was defendant's brother-in-law. He could swear he had not more than three glasses of beer. He could swear he had not treated more than once. He did not know defendant's brothers, and did not actually know the defendant's brother-in-law. He could not say why defendant had torn up his collar. Defendant was making some remarks about starch-collared men. He would swear that never heard anyone chaffing the defendant about his collar being a paper one and not a linen collar. 				<p>would take the best man in the room to tear up his. He did not challenge the defendant to fight. He did not take off his coat ; it was pulled off his back. He would say that the defendant wanted to tear up his (witness') collar. He did not lift his hands to strike the defendant. He would swear he was sober. He had spoken to Ransome and Howes casually once or twice.</p> <p>By the Mayor - He had stated that he would not allow the defendant to take his collar off. -</p> <p>Thomas Ransome said that he was a traveller, and lived at Norwich, His address in Lowestoft was 7, Crown Street. On Thursday last he was in the Crown tap in the afternoon, and he remembered Hunt coming in. The time would be about a quarter to five. He saw the defendant there. Several other people were in the bar. The defendant he saw take off his collar, tear it up, and approach Hunt and say that he could tear off any other man's collar. Hunt said that he should not allow him to do that. Hunt then sat down, and Esau Gray came up and punched Hunt in the eye. Hunt took off his coat, and all three men, with them the defendant, surrounded him "like bees." Defendant had a knife in his hand, and stuck it into the complainant's hand. He tried to separate the parties after Hunt was cut, the door was opened, and Hunt ran outside, the three following. He was between Hunt and the three. He heard Gus Gray say that he would do for Hunt. Hunt did not in any way challenge the defendant to fight. Hunt was not the worse for drink. Hunt went round to the hotel to wash, and a policeman came up and ordered the Grays to move off. He was a perfect stranger to Hunt, and never knew him before he met him in the bar. A man named Howes was in the bar.</p> <p>Cross-examined by Mr. Ferrier - He could not suggest why the man tore off his collar. It seemed a very absurd thing to do. He could not say what the knife was like, but he saw the blade. He could see about one inch of blade in the scuffle. Why he did not call for the police was because he did not think anything about the affair. He had seen Hunt since the fight occurred, and had never mentioned a word to him about the matter except that it was brutal thing, and he would appear as his witness. He would swear that he did not see Hunt on Friday, and was only in his company ten minutes. He did not see Hunt on Sunday. Hunt had treated him once since the affair.</p> <p>Re-examined by Mr. Bracey - The defendant had the handle of the knife up his sleeve, with the blade between his fingers. He was drinking nothing but "small lemons," and was not drunk.</p> <p>William B. Hewes said he was a traveller, and his home was at Norwich. On Thursday last he was in the Crown Hotel tap and saw Hunt there and the defendant. He saw Gray take his collar off, tear it up in front of Hunt, and go back a little nearer to Hunt. Gray threw the collar down, and said he could take any man's collar off in the room. To this Hunt said he should not allow anyone to take his (Hunt's) collar off. After that one of the Grays struck Hunt a heavy blow on the left side of the face. Hunt got up to defend himself, and in so doing this defendant approached him with a knife in his hand. The handle was in the sleeve, a portion of the blade between his fingers. Defendant made a lunge with the knife at Hunt's face, and Hunt put up his hand and received the blade in the palm. After this Hunt went out into the yard, and heard one of the prisoners say that he would do for Hunt. Witness followed Hunt into the hotel and saw the wound. The hole was an inch long. There were really two cuts, the first was clean and long and the second was jagged and small. The prosecutor was sober, and he did not hear Hunt challenge either this defendant or any of the Gray family. There were five of the Gray family in the bar at the time.</p> <p>By Mr. Adams - There was only one thrust, and that, he believed, caused two cuts.</p> <p>Cross-examined by Mr. Ferrier - He had said that one of the cuts were jagged. He did not see Hunt take up a jug with his hand and strike the defendant on the head. There was a basket of crockery there. This basket was about a yard away from Hunt. There was another basket containing sundries, a hawker's basket. The wound was a jagged one. The wound was not caused by a piece of earthenware but by a knife. Prior to the collar being torn off there was some conversation between the Grays. The knife would be a knife of about six to eight inches long. It would be a pocket knife with a coloured horn handle. He did not see the defendant take the knife from his pocket. He had had a glass or two of ale. He had been in a public-house with Hunt since the affair.</p> <p>By the Mayor - When Hunt got up from the chair he took hold of one of the Grays - not the defendant - and took him towards the door. Hunt had no chance to defend himself with his fists, but simply struggled. He did not see any broken crockery about the room. He saw a jug thrown, but he did not know whom it struck. It struck someone on the back of the head.</p> <p>Esau Gray, the brother of the former, was charged with assault on the same date.</p> <p>Joshua Gray, the eldest brother, was also charged with assault on the same occasion.</p> <p>At this stage all three cases were adjourned until Thursday next, the defendants being allowed out on bail.</p>

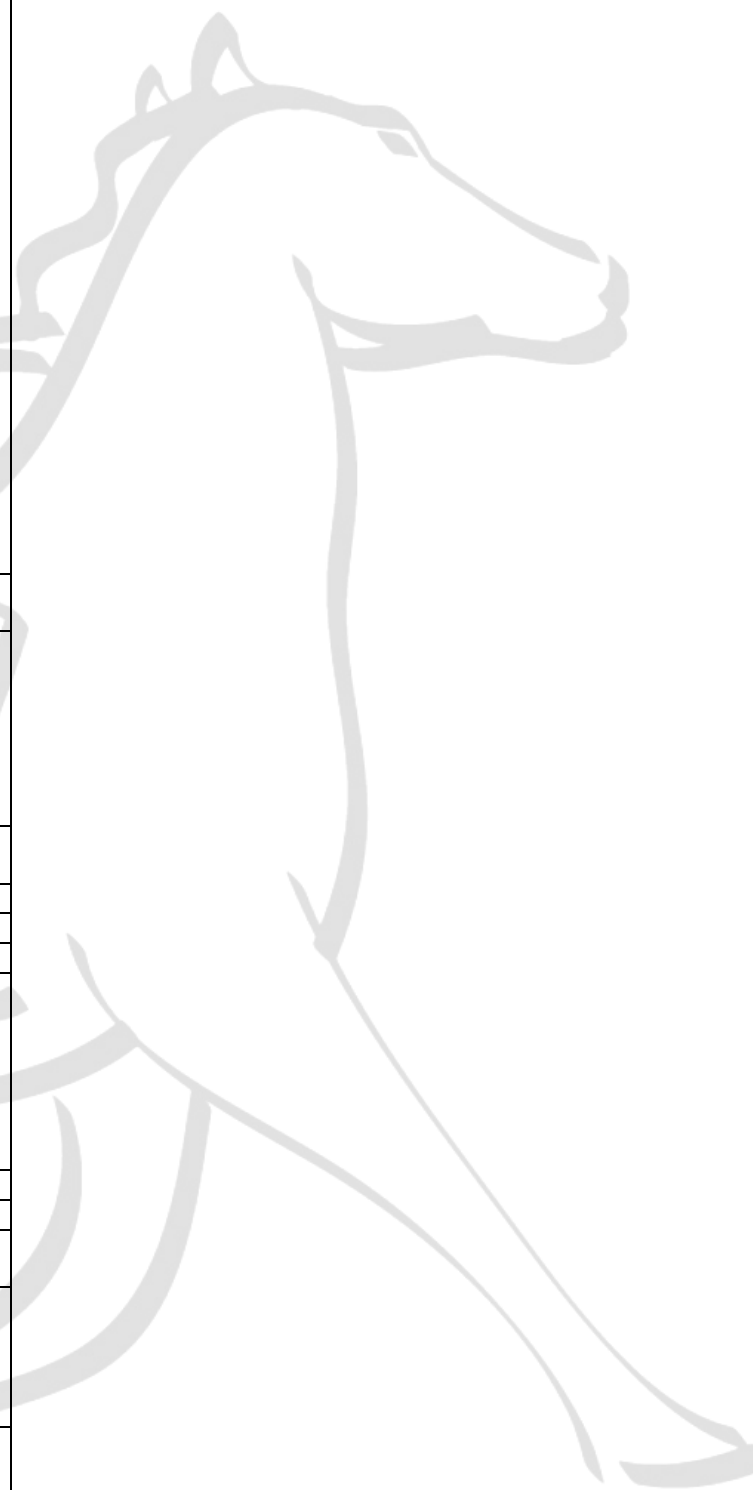

Frederick Gray, travelling hawker, was brought up in custody on a charge of obtaining by false pretences from Harry J. Oakes a suit of clothes to the value of £3 10s. 6d., with intent to cheat and defraud him. Mr. S. Linay defended. Harry John Oakes said on or about February 2nd prisoner and two other men came to his shop in Dereham, and prisoner gave him an order for a suit of clothes. Witness asked him where he lived, and prisoner said he was living at Shipdham, and was a householder. He said his name was Harry Gray. On the following Friday prisoner came again to the shop with the two other men, and prosecutor handed him the trousers and promised to have the coat and vest ready by the following Friday. When prisoner took the trousers away prosecutor gave him the bill of them, and he said I may as well let them be until I come for the other things. On the following Friday prisoner and the other men came again, and prosecutor handed him the coat and vest. Prisoner had previously called on the same day and promised to pay for the goods later on in the day, when they were ready. When he called the second time prisoner said he had spent all his money since he had called two hours before, and he asked prosecutor to let him have the clothes and he would pay on the following Friday. He again repeated that he was living at Shipdham, and was a householder. Because he said he was a householder at Shipdham prosecutor let him have the goods. Police-constable Frederick Woodward said he had been stationed at Shipdham about five years, and he knew the parish and inhabitants well. Prisoner was not a householder at Shipdham, and to the best of witness's belief he had never lived in a house there. Cross-examined : I believe a travelling van was there in February belonging to a man named Herbert Tann, I suppose a person who lives in a van calls it their house. I have heard them speak of their van as their home. Police-sergeant Wilkins said on Thursday morning he arrested prisoner on the present charge, and asked him for the trousers. Prisoner said he had worn them up, but witness insisted on searching for them, and they were given to him by prisoner's wife. He had previously received the coat from prisoner. He produced the bill given by Mr. Oakes ; it was found in the coat pocket. Mr. Linay addressed the magistrates in defence, and pleaded that defendant said he lived in a house, referring to his van, which was in reality his home, and that prosecutor allowed him to take the goods away upon the condition that he paid for them on the following Friday, and not in consequence of any statement that might have been made in respect to his living at Shipdham. A bargain to that effect was made at Wroxham about eight weeks ago, while in the van, and no one else was present. There was no agreement drawn up. Neither he nor defendant could read or write. The Chairman told the defendant he had no one but himself to blame for being apprehended; but, as he had been in custody for a week, the Bench would now give him the benefit of the doubt and dismiss the case. On the Friday, the first day of the fair, they had not yet come to an agreement, and on the afternoon of that day Harris shot the Grays with a revolver, and was at once arrested.</p> <p>Frederick Gray, whose right arm was in a sling, was allowed to sit in front of the witness box. Describing the negotiations for the ground, he stated there was no heated feeling between them.
