



DIRECTORY OF TRAVELLING PHOTOGRAPHERS

INTRODUCTION TO PART 2 - 1882-1921

Please note that for a general introduction and context, with a short list of sources, including websites and key publications, readers are invited to also consult Part 1.

The original list in this research was intended as a starting point to find travelling photographers, primarily in the period from the 1840s-1901. However, as the number of entries grew, it was decided to focus initially on the period 1841-1881, which gave rise to Part 1. This second Part follows the same pattern but starts at 1882. However, the period has been extended to cover the 1921 census so that each Part covers roughly a forty-year period.

As new sources come online new entries are found, or other corroborative evidence becomes available. Entries have been taken from a wider range of sources including Ancestry, FindMyPast, The Genealogist, British Newspaper Archive, Newspapers.com, plus finds in census and parish records, historical journals & books. Consequently, a separate list of additions both for the period 1841-1881, and from 1922 onwards, is being kept, but separate for the time being, so that previous users do not have to go through every entry again. In due course, it is hoped that the lists can be consolidated.

Since Part 1 was produced new key words or phrases have been found which help identify subjects: for example, journeyman photographer, portable studio and caravan studio. However, there is no consistency in how travelling photographers are described in even official records like the census. This means that some will almost certainly have been missed, and possibly others included when they should not have been.

Although the entries have been kept concise, this does not reflect the work often required to substantiate information. For example, a mention frequently has to be cross checked with a range of other sources and a profile built up for a particular extended family. Where a surname is given in an original source there may not be any forenames, spellings can be erratic, and several individuals can have the same name. Given the hundreds of persons identified to date, it has not been possible to research every person in detail.

The notes below are repeated and amplified for ease of use and understanding. Brief indications have been given of date, name, place, and context where known, and appropriate. Not all sources provide full details, and some locations are surmised from other information in nearby text. Traditional or historic county names have used for the most part, but this approach does present some problems in consistency, especially for parishes that were incorporated into Greater London. Further research is still needed to extend the listings for Ireland and Scotland, though more entries have now been found for Wales. The First World War provided few entries though other sources for this period will now be explored further.

Where dates have been found readily these are given but note that dates of birth and death may be approximate by several years, or totally inaccurate in many cases, depending on the original record. However, they can indicate a period in which further searches may be concentrated. In general, the reference and date are for the earliest instance of someone found as a photographer. That does not mean it is the earliest date they were earning a living through photography: some entries might be found in Part 1, while in other cases earlier records may not yet have been

located. A mention as a photographer in an earlier record does not mean the person was not a travelling photographer at that point, though it may take later records to show that they indeed travelled during their career.

Events have been recorded once but note that there may be other and different accounts, especially in newspapers around the same date, possibly with more details. In a few cases additional detail from other accounts have been added in. Some associated material has been included where it might provide background, an early example of its kind or is generally of interest in understanding the evolution of photography more widely.

Person and place names are often problematic or inconsistent within and from record to record, and over time, so extra care needs to be taken if searching. Details for names given in brackets have been identified from other sources. Some surnames have been corrected from transcriptions to those on the original record, where it is possible to check or there is additional information on other records for the same person. Note that similarities or differences cannot be assumed as proof of people being the same person, or not! Recordings for visitors, boarders and lodgers often hide or mis-record relationships with the head or others in the same household.

It should be remembered that early spellings and transcriptions were not fixed: parish clerks, enumerators and other recorders may not have been fully literate; speakers may have had strong accents, elisions or burrs; and some written characters are easily mistaken in transcription e.g. H, K, M, N. Note a few travellers deliberately hid or obscured their true identity, if indeed they had only one. In some cases there is clear evidence of aliases and alternatives are given, if known.

Where different travelling photographers occur in the same record they have usually been itemised separately, but note some additional names are given in notes e.g. family, employees, key witnesses, other photographers. It is likely that some entries are for the same person though this should not be assumed without corroborative evidence as names were often repeated in the same families. A little licence has been taken where references to the, probably, same person can throw light on their identity or activities.

Readers will note that some persons have more than one entry, and others may not be proven travelling photographers. This can be for several reasons. Mainly it is intended to provide clues for better identification, illustration of career development and, in a few cases, examples of related activity such as trade in photographic goods and travelling vans. On balance the compiler has included items where it was felt it would add richer context to understanding the lives of travelling photographers, individually and often as a group of families within the wider travelling community.

Additional entries or evidence are welcomed. If possible, please give brief details and sources, as demonstrated below, so that they can be checked against originals. There are surely many entries, and stories, still to be found, especially as optical character recognition and transcriptions improve.

SEARCH TERMS

The key words used include various combinations and word order of the following terms and derivations: artist, photographer, showman, hawker, travel/(l)ing/itinerant, van/caravan, studio, photo/graph/ic/ical, portable, gallery/glasshouse/studio etc. Earlier records tend to use the phrase 'photographic artist' or even just 'artist' rather than photographer, and the term 'photographist' has also been found.

In the latter part of the nineteenth century the term 'journeyman photographer' appears which could refer to a range of roles: for example, those in junior roles gaining skills (though formal apprenticeship does not seem to have existed), those working for an employer, those working on commission from an established photographer, or those who were ordinary photographers in their own right, but travelling.

In parallel there are increasing references to those who travelled in connection with selling photographic goods, as commercial travellers: these have been excluded where it is clear that they were not themselves photographers, but it is possible a few errors have crept in. Other travelling roles included canvassers working for photographic concerns, and even one found as a demonstrator for Kodak. Another description found in the later period refers to 'travelling photographer, enlargements' or similar: these have generally been included pending further clarification of their role.

As alluded to above, it is not always apparent that someone is a photographer or a travelling photographer without cross-referencing between various records. For example, there are census records where the enumerator has simply put 'showman' or 'hawker' for all the people in group of travellers, without distinguishing exactly what they were doing. Sometimes the only clue is a mention of a caravan or van, or perhaps a range of birthplaces for children.

Where using online family history sites, please note that the terms above may appear in different parts of records: using open searches may reveal more returns. For example, 'caravan' can appear in the address but also under occupation, while in censuses there may be enumerator notes or added details in the first page where the enumeration district is described. Where a likely location is already known, but names are problematic, then searching the last pages of the enumeration district or section may yield results: they are where enumerators tended to record 'vagrants' or those not living in houses but in barns, outhouses, caravans, and tents.

It is important to always check both the transcription and the original record as they can differ substantially: full information may not always be saved directly into family trees. Ideally, records should be checked across more than one family history site as the methods of scanning, transcription and searching are not identical, with results hidden in one but revealed in another.

Please continue to note the caveat that listings of photographers in general directories, and those specifically for photographers, tend to relate to those with fixed premises and a permanent address. However, many photographers travelled at some time or other, perhaps starting their career on the road before settling.

SEARCH SORT

To show the development of travelling photography throughout the 19th century entries have been sorted by year when activity appears to have taken place, which may not be the year in which it was reported. Census entries have been grouped at the beginning of the census year; census dates given below.

To search for a particular person or place, go to top of first page and press the 'Control+f' buttons at the same time to carry out a search.
