Prosecutor took out his purse to do so, when the prisoner snatched it away, but eventually gave it back to him. Stannard, farmer, of Greenstead. - Mr. JONES appeared for the prisoner. - Prosecutor's son deposed that about 8 o'clock on Tuesday evening last he saw the prisoner and several boys and girls in one of his father's fields picking wheat off the traves. Witness ran after and caught the prisoner, who was carrying the basket now produced, about two-thirds full of ears of corn. He could not state that he saw prisoner put any corn into the basket ; but on asking what he did it for he replied that one of the girls, named Sarah Steggles, had given him a penny to pick some for her. He asked prisoner what the girl did with the corn, and he said she sold it to Mr. Dale, of the Barley Mow. Prisoner afterwards confessed that he took the wheat. - In reply to the Bench, prosecutor said he was obliged to bring the case forward in consequence of the number of similar depredations to which he was subjected. - Mr. JONES contended that prisoner, who was only eight years old, had given a truthful account of the affair, and that the prosecution should have taken steps to bring the girl Steggles befor the Bench, either as a witness or a accessory.
