Phoenix's trade is that of a tinker - his wife is a dealer in <i>palmetry</i> ... The Gypsies have undoubtedly a form of government amongst themselves, and to their King pay the most implicit obedience ; to this submission we may fairly attribute their apparent happiness ; - they have no false honour amongst them, and they look upon shame as the most grievous punishment in the world. - ...Phoenix' trade is that of a tinker — his wife is a dealer in palmistry... We learn that in a few days, at or near Holwell-mouth, by Melton Mowbray, there will be a general meeting of Gypsies from Leicestershire and the neighbouring counties, to celebrate the nuptials of Phoenix with the King's daughter. The Gypsies have undoubtedly a form of government amongst themselves, and to their King pay the most implicit obedience ; to this submission we may fairly attribute their apparent happiness. One of their favourite encampments has long been in an open yard, with a narrow entrance between two houses. Here they pitch their tents around three sides of the square, with an open space in the middle. This might be called Gipsy-square, and it was here the group was taken, which appears as the frontispiece. At the farther end of the square is a cabin, considerably more substantial than the usual tent residences. This abode was formerly an advertising van for Astley's theatre. 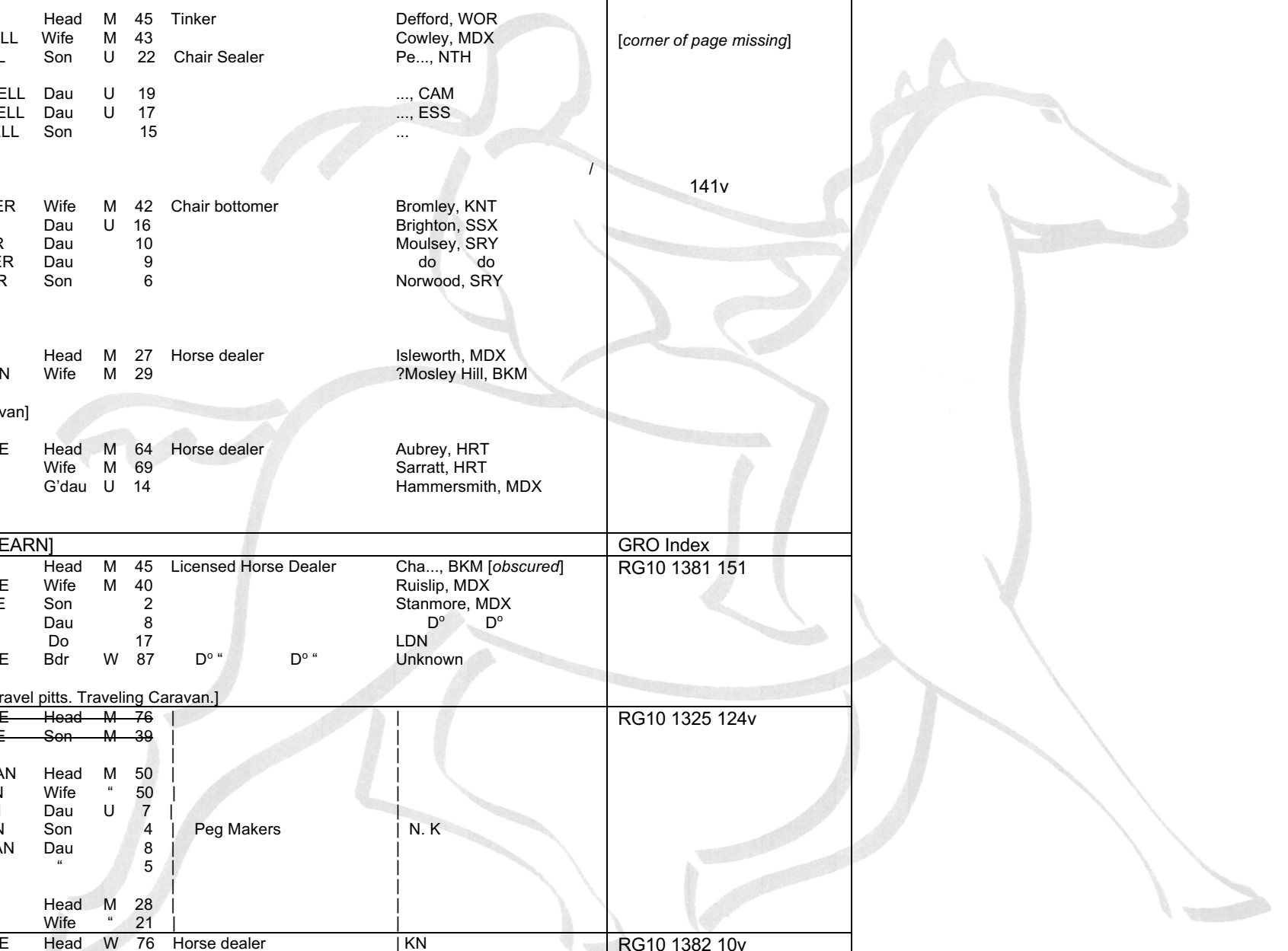
