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		Horsemonger Lane, SRY		Lovell, all of the Gipsy tribe, were brought to the bar to answer the matters of complaint exhibited against them. This was stated to the Court as a prosecution instituted by the Society for the Suppression of Vice, to endeavour to correct the scandalous practice of those Gipsies in bringing idle persons about them at Norwood, to have their fortunes told on a Sunday ; it was to correct and suppress that evil that had induced the Society to come forward to punish them, still wishing, that were there a ray of hope of amendment, the parties might be acquitted for this time. The whole were examined, and the charge of fortune-telling proved against them, but on expressing their contrition for the past, and promising never to offend again in like manner, they were liberated. Charlotte Allen, who appeared the mother and leader of the set, having six young children, was discharged on finding bail for her future good behaviour. Pentevinney Lovell did not meet so mild a sentence. The evidence against her proved that she not only told the young Gentleman's fortune to be rich, happy, and have a full enjoyment of all his wishes, but seeing him when he came up with a young Lady, she asked him the nature of their connexion ; he said she was his sweetheart ; the wily Gipsy then, in very plain terms, offered her service to tell her fortune, when she pledged herself that she would work upon her as to make her subservient to all his desires – this, it should seem, by the evidence before the Court, was the main point of their schemes, it being a general rule with abandoned libertines to ingratiate themselves with young and inexperienced femailes, whom they take on a pleasureable party to Norwood ; there they dine, and, the poor girls flushed with wine, sally forth to get their fortunes told ; the Gentleman has his fortune told first. The plan is then laid what is to be said to work upon the feelings of the poor victim, who thus, by a combination of circumstances, is plunged into inevitable ruin. This fact, melancholy as it is, has been established beyond contradiction, and is the chief reason of the Society using their utmost efforts to suppress the practice. One morning, at breakfast time, two gipsies came to my master's and ordered a coffin of a certain length and width, but without any breast-plate. Mr. Poyner said he would rather measure the deceased person himself, but they replied it was too far to go. They agreed upon the price of the coffin, which was to be taken to Hadley Heath, or common (now enclosed). This, as far as I recollect, was on a Wednesday, and the coffin was to be there on the following Sunday morning. About eight or nine o'clock my master and I took it to the place described, where, on the ground, lay the body of a dead gipsy - a very fine young man about twenty-two years old. There was a large number of gipsies present. They had a fire burning, and some of the boys were roasting a hedge hog, which they declared they preferred to roast beef. The gipsies paid for the coffin, and we left them. The end of the unfortunate man had been a sad one. He had been hung at Gloucester for horse stealing, and I found that he had been brought from Gloucester on the previous Saturday night... Time flew, and several years afterwards, as I was standing in the village, a tribe of gipsies came by, playing tambourines and violins. They walked into the old churchyard and played over the grave of their long-buried comrade. They then went to the sexton and requested him to briar up the grave again and make it decent, for which they paid him, and marched down the village playing, and several of the party crying. 1864	August	Wandsworth, SRY	died	On Tuesday, Mr. Humphreys held an inquest at the Greyhound tavern, Old Ford-road, Victoria-park, respecting the death of Barbara Lee, aged ninety years, a celebrated member of the gipsy tribe, who died in a tent. The jury having been sworn, proceeded with the coroner across a meadow to a low tent which was protected from the weather by a dwarf wall abutting on Sir George Duckett's canal. When Mr. Burrows, the summoning officer, removed several wooden skewers from the dingy woollen covering the body of deceased was found lying on the turf covered with a white sheet, and near the corpse lay a rough or wild sheep dog. 				formerly been the gipsy queen. The first witness called was Keziah Lee, a young gipsy, who said that she was a "traveller," and had no settled residence. She lived in a field near Mr. Bowen's, the Crown hotel, Old Ford-road. Witness was the wife of Benjamin Lee, a gipsy, who attended races and fairs, and obtained a livelihood by keeping "Old Aunt Sally's" and "Cookshies." The deceased was a widow, and witness was her daughter-in-law. She lived with witness, as she had no home nor friends to assist her. Sometimes they had six or seven in the same tent, but they never had any sickness, the air was so pure, and although the deceased was so aged she walked or tramped from the encampment on Wandsworth-common. She was very weak and careworn, but was not ailing or in bad health. She could eat anything when she could get it. On Saturday night, the deceased ate a hearty supper in the tent, and there were several persons present who slept there all night. There was a fire burning until the morning. About eight o'clock the witness awoke and heard the deceased making a gurgling noise in the throat. Witness got up and ran for Dr. Davey, who immediately attended and pronounced life extinct. The deceased was then upon the face of the earth, but well wrapped up. Coroner (to witness) : Your tribe live longer in such places, do they not? - Witness (smiling) : Oh, yes, sir. Why, if she had gone to the workhouse she would have been dead years ago. - Coroner : I believe that, for a "gipsy's tent" is a palace to some of the overcrowded and pestilential dwellings at this part of the great metropolis. Charlotte Lee, another gipsy, with a brown and sharp countenance, said that she lived in White's brickfield, Old Ford-road. She called to see the "old lady," and stopped in the tent all night. The deceased was then very poorly, and could not get up. She could speak and knew witness, who had travelled from Kingston to see her. The deceased never complained while witness was present, and she had what they could afford to give her. A surgeon was not called, as deceased had never had a day's illness. - Coroner : Are you not related to the family of the Gipsy Queen? - Witness : Yes. sir, but she is no more than our own humble tribe. Why, our queen is your Queen, and we bow to her as her loyal subjects. Dr. Davey, of Florence-villa, Old Ford-road, said that he was called to the deceased, and found her in a tent lying upon the ground. She was still warm, but had only been dead about a quarter of an hour. He examined the body, which was pretty well nourished, and he believed as there were no marks of violence that she had died from exhaustion upon old age. The coroner said the case was one of an unusual character, and he should not have troubled the jury, but that the deceased had died in such a sudden and strange manner. There was, however, no doubt that the habit of living in such open air places was beneficial, and had in this instance prolonged the life of the deceased, who had almost reached 100 years.

Inspector Good and two constables accordingly went in pursuit, and traced the gipsies to No Man's Land, where they had encamped, their horses, five in number, quietly grazing in a farmer's turnip field. On attempting to take the party into custody, they resisted so stoutly that the police were compelled to give up the contest. Having, however, procured some volunteer assistance amongst the neighbouring farmers and labourers, the police continued in pursuit of the gang, and came up with them at Pepperstock. On examining their carts, a number of silver-mounted whips, new silk handkerchiefs, and a variety of other articles, which the police believed to have been stolen, were found. Two of the horses answered the description of horses advertised in the <i>Hue and Cry</i> . - The police asked for a remand, in order to enable them to trace the property to the owner. - The bench accordingly remanded the prisoners, but allowed one of them, Susan Lee, to go at large for the purpose of procuring evidence to show that the property rightfully belonged to her father. - Josiah Lee, one of the prisoners, was then charged with obtaining two shillings of Mrs. Webb, wife of Sir E. L. Bulwer Lytton's steward, under false pretences. - It appeared that the prisoner went to Mr. Webb's house with some powder for destroying rats, which, he said, Mr. Webb had told him to leave there. By this representation he received two shillings - Mr. Webb stated that he met the prisoner when leaving home on Thursday, but he had no communication with him. - The prisoner was committed for trial.	<i>Reynolds's Weekly Newspaper</i> , 6 October 1850, 5

He saw her several weeks afterwards at home in his own yard ; knew her again by a white star in her forehead. Cross-examined by Mr. Talfourd - The star in the forehead was a very unusual mark ; had had the ass seven years, but could not tell if she was seven years old (laughter). Mary Kidson, the wife of the prosecutor, left the ass in the yard about half-past nine o'clock on the evening of the 4th of May, then fastened the gate, and went to bed. Her husband got up first ; thought he took the donkey to ride to his work, and expected to find her in the lane ; looked all day, but could not find her. Saw her again the 3d June ; went to Brooks's-lane in consequence of something I heard ; there I saw a camp of gypsies, and a little boy riding on my ass. I went up to her and said, "Jenny, oh dear Jenny! where have you been to all this time;" and the ass knew me as well as I knew her, and I went to the camp and claimed her, and a man said, "Belcher, here is a woman come to claim your donkey," who answered, "I bought her fair enough, but if it was hers she might take it till he could find the person he bought her of." He also offered to lend her a bridle, which she declined ; so she put her shawl round her ass's neck, and led her from the other asses, when she released her, and she followed her home. Prisoner was the man who said he bought the ass, and she was sure the ass was hers ; she knew it by the mark in the forehead, and she should have known it without that mark or any other. She also foaled on the 26th June, which was the time she expected her to foal. Cross-examined by Mr. Talfourd - Several persons had been to see the donkey she believed, two only of whom she had seen. It was on the morning of the 5th of May that she was missing. The husband had said it was missing on the evening of the 5th, and was re-called, but he did not appear capable of giving a suitable reply to a question, nor understand indeed the questions proposed to him, but it was concluded that the woman was right, and that the man was <i>non compos mentis</i>. Mary Ann Hughes identified Lee and the donkey, whom she saw going to Ascot Heath Races on the 8th of June. Thomas Kidson also saw prisoner with a company of gypsies on the 8th June, and tha [<i>sic</i>] ass in question was with them, and he sent word to Mrs. Kidson. - John Minchin, a lad who formerly used to ride the ass, identified her as the property of the prosecutor. - William Stevens, constable of Clewer, was called, by whom it appears that Russell, brother-in-law to the prisoner, had been sent by him to re-obtain the ass from Kidson. Russell pointed out Lee as the person claiming the property, and Stevens took him into custody. --- How, a jobber from Brentwood, was then called for the defence, who stated that soon after Fairlop fair, June 8th, 1828, he bought this ass, and sold her on the 9th, at Romford Market, at six o'clock in the morning, to prisoner, for 24s. There are two persons here who saw me sell her. I have seen the ass in dispute, and say it is of the same colour and age; but I think it more likely, if he speak truth, thait [<i>sic</i>] it is not the very same ; and then very sagaciously remarked "but if it is the ass I sold to Lee it is the one I sold at Romford." "That is," replied his Lordship, "if it is the same, it is the same." E. Davis, a farming servant of Waltham Abbey, was present at the above deal, and was sure it was the same donkey, though he could give no reason but its being a light coloured one ; he did not even know that it had a star on its forehead ; he did not know what his business was at Romford, he often went ; it was three hours walk from Waltham Abbey ; never set out till seven o'clock in the morning ; (How said the ass was sold at six o'clock). In fact, he could remember everything about the deal but nothing else. Benjamin Fletcher, a ragman from Chelmsford, once had a donkey in his possession, which he sold to a stranger.
