The whole comprised a gang of gipsies, of three generations, from the decrepit old man to the infant at the breast. They have long infested the Old-road, and the adjacent lanes, near the Old Prince of Orange, and as long have annoyed the public by fortune-telling, begging, and stealing. Several of them were apprehended this morning, about six o'clock, under Mr. Collier's cart sheds, and others in the Old-road. Now that there are fewer foolish people from London than there were ready to be duped out of their money by these fortune-tellers, and beggars, Mr. Collier, perhaps, thinks his property will not be so safe as it has been through the summer, and is determined on their removal. The prisoners all seemed to be very much alarmed at Mr. Justice Oakes's grave address, and still graver intimations of sending them all to Maidstone gaol. Delany Baker, a young woman, was the eloquent pleader for the entire party, and in kind words, and fluent sentences, prayed the magistrates lenity in allowing them to remove to Sheerness, where, she said, they were going this morning, had they not been taken by the police. The defendants were all discharged on the faith of their promise immediately to leave the town ; and they were gravely assured if they were seen in the borough after this day they must take the consequence, which would be very different from the treatment they had now experienced.	<i>The West Kent Guardian</i> , 24 September 1842, 5-6

Edward Thomas Duley, a farmer, residing at Gillingham, stated that the four prisoners were encamped under a hedge on his land on Saturday, the 14th inst. The men Gardner and Simpson came on the Wednesday following, and Lee and Smith on the Saturday, and although he had ordered them off they refused to go until a constable came. Between the Wednesday and the Saturday the tackle of one of his ploughs was stolen, and by their fires his hedge had suffered severely. They had horses and donkeys, and by their getting on to his seed land they had done serious injury. Thomas Bines said, that when he arrived at the tent the men had a large fire with a whole faggot on it. On the prisoners, being asked what they had got to say for themselves, Gardner and Smith was not there, as described by the complainant ; and Lee stated that he bought the wood for his fire, that he had two boys who go out with him daily to work as knife grinders and menders of pots and kettles [sic], and one of his sons was then mending his grinding cart in Strood ; and Simpson said he had a wife and child at Strood very ill. The Bench told the prisoners that it was necessary to make an example of them, and to prove to others that they were not to lay about on the open land and commit such depredations as they think proper, they should inflict a severe punishment, by adjudging Amos Lee and James Gardner to six weeks' hard labour, and Smith and Simpson to one month and hard labour in the House of Correction at Maidstone. The wife of Simpson (one of the gipsy tribe) asked the magistrate what was to become of her - she had got one child, who was very ill, and she could do nothing for herself. This was a complete Gipsy trick ; and interesting for the cunning and amazing expense of the defence, for whom Mr. Talfourd was retained. Geo. Kidson was first called, and all the other witnesses ordered out of Court. He lost his ass the 5th May ; saw it in the morning of the 5th in a lane, as he went to work ; the ass was missing in the evening when he returned. He saw her several weeks afterwards at home in his own yard ; knew her again by a white star in her forehead. Cross-examined by Mr. Talfourd - The star in the forehead was a very unusual mark ; had had the ass seven years, but could not tell if she was seven years old (laughter). Mary Kidson, the wife of the prosecutor, left the ass in the yard about half-past nine o'clock on the evening of the 4th of May, then fastened the gate, and went to bed. Her husband got up first ; thought he took the donkey to ride to his work, and expected to find her in the lane ; looked all day, but could not find her. Saw her again the 3d June ; went to Brooks' s-lane in consequence of something I heard ; there I saw a camp of gypsies, and a little boy riding on my ass. I went up to her and said, "Jenny, oh dear Jenny! where have you been to all this time;" and the ass knew me as well as I knew her, and I went to the camp and claimed her, and a man said, "Belcher, here is a woman come to claim your donkey," who answered, "I bought her fair enough, but if it was hers she might take it till he could find the person he bought her of." He also offered to lend her a bridle, which she declined ; so she put her shawl round her ass's neck, and led her from the other asses, when she released her, and she followed her home. Prisoner was the man who said he bought the ass, and she was sure the ass was hers ; she knew it by the mark in the forehead, and she should have known it without that mark or any other. She also foaled on the 26th June, which was the time she expected her to foal. Cross-examined by Mr. Talfourd - Several persons had been to see the donkey she believed, two only of whom she had seen. It was on the morning of the 5th of May that she was missing. The husband had said it was missing on the evening of the 5th, and was re-called, but he did not appear capable of giving a suitable reply to a question, nor understand indeed the questions proposed to him, but it was concluded that the woman was right, and that the man was <i>non compos mentis</i> . Mary Ann Hughes identified Lee and the donkey, whom she saw going to Ascot Heath Races on the 8th of June. Thomas Kidson also saw prisoner with a company of gypsies on the 8th June, and tha <i>[sic]</i> ass in question was with them, and he sent word to Mrs. Kidson. - John Minchin, a lad who formerly used to ride the ass, identified her as the property of the prosecutor. - William Stevens, constable of Clewer, was called, by whom it appears that Russell, brother-in-law to the prisoner, had been sent by him to re-obtain the ass from Kidson. Russell pointed out Lee as the person claiming the property, and Stevens took him into custody. --- How, a jobber from Brentwood, was then called for the defence, who stated that soon after Fairlop fair, June 8th, 1828, he bought this ass, and sold her on the 9th, at Romford Market, at six o'clock in the morning, to prisoner, for 24s. There are two persons here who saw me sell her. I have seen the ass in dispute, and say it is of the same colour and age; but I think it more likely, if he speak truth, thait <i>[sic]</i> it is not the very same ; and then very sagaciously remarked "but if it is the ass I sold to Lee it is the	<i>The Reading Mercury</i> , 19 July, 2

				one I sold at Romford.” “That is,” replied his Lordship, “if it is the same, it is the same.” E. Davis, a farming servant of Waltham Abbey, was present at the above deal, and was sure it was the same donkey, though he could give no reason but its being a light coloured one ; he did not even know that it had a star on its forehead ; he did not know what his business was at Romford, he often went ; it was three hours walk from Waltham Abbey ; never set out till seven o’clock in the morning ; (How said the ass was sold at six o’clock). In fact, he could remember everything about the deal but nothing else. Benjamin Fletcher, a ragman from Chelmsford, once had a donkey in his possession, which he sold to a stranger. He saw it in possession of Lee ; saw her again last Friday, it was shewn him by Mrs. Kidson ; knew her again by several marks ; which he had no doubt noticed for the first time on Friday last. - Edward Buckland also was partly sure it was the ass of the prisoner. - Zachariah Lee, brother to the prisoner, also knew the ass to have been in the prisoner’s possession more than a year. - But all would not do ; the jury returned a verdict of Guilty, and the Court sentenced him to ‘12 calendar months’ hard labour.

He stopped on the road with his cart near chalk, and tied the poney’s legs [sic] and turned it out to feed on the road side. Witness slept in the cart, and got up between 4 and 5 and missed the poney [sic]. Went to Gravesend and found it in the stable at the Catherine Wheel. --- Bennett, ostler of the Catherine Wheel, Gravesend, stated that the prisoner brought the poney to that house on the 19th of June [sic]. Prisoner asked if he knew any one at Gravesend who would buy it, and offered to sell it to witness for 50s., then 40s., and afterwards 30s. He said he would not mind losing 10s. by it, for he wished he had not bought it. Mr. William Alexander Bennett, apprehended the prisoner and told him the charge against him. Witness said he thought he was a deserter, which he denied at first, but afterwards acknowledged that he had deserted from the 95th regiment. Observed no symptoms of derangement about him at that time, but subsequently he exhibited extravagant gestures and talked incoherently. Mr. Taunton, surgeon to the county gaol, was of opinion that the prisoner was not in his right senses. Had never seen him otherwise than in an insane state. Mr. Agar, governor of the prisons, stated that he was of the opinion the prisoner was not in his right senses. William Chapman, one of the turnkeys, had observed the prisoner’s conduct and considered him in a state of insanity. Police constable K 69 stated that on Friday night, about half-past nine o'clock, he was in Epping Forest, when he saw a pony and a donkey running about loose. Supposing some gypsies had encamped in the forest, he went in search of them, and found the prisoner lying by the side of a cart fast asleep on the ground. He roused him up and asked him how he came there, when he replied that he was sleeping out because he had had a row with his wife, who lived at Chingford Hatch. He then took him into custody. - Mr. Maitland, one of the magistrates, said the gypsies during the winter took houses in the villages surrounding the forest, but the moment the fine weather set in they left them, and went to reside in the forest. The Chairman said if they were able to pay rent for a house during the winter, they certainly were in the summer, and he should order the police to apprehend all persons found sleeping in the forest. In answer to the charge, the prisoner said he was on his way to Epsom, but hearing Woodford clock strike nine, he thought that was too late an hour to go through London, so he laid down in the forest, intending to start at early dawn. Two of the horses answered the description of horses advertised in the <i>Hue and Cry</i> . - The police asked for a remand, in order to enable them to trace the property to the owner. - The bench accordingly remanded the prisoners, but allowed one of them, Susan Lee, to go at large for the purpose of procuring evidence to show that the property rightfully belonged to her father. - Josiah Lee, one of the prisoners, was then charged with obtaining two shillings of Mrs. Webb, wife of Sir E. L. Bulwer Lytton's steward, under false pretences. - It appeared that the prisoner went to Mr. Webb's house with some powder for destroying rats, which, he said, Mr. Webb had told him to leave there. As soon as the bride and her attendants arrived, a great rush was made into the Church, and the doors were obliged to be closed to keep out a portion of the crowd. The face of the bride, as she approached the altar, beamed with Asiatic expression ; her features were of a very pleasing character, and not so deeply tinged as is commonly the case among those of her tribe. The bridegroom and his brother were remarkably handsome men. The party were dressed after the fashion of the race - in the gayest and most fantastic colours. Upon their egress from the Church, they were followed by the crowd to Mr. King's, and the wedded party gratified the people by appearing at the window, apparently much pleased with being the object of such attraction. The wedding dinner, we understand, was held at a farm house, near the spot where their tents were pitched. After dinner they proceeded to the Bear, at Berkswell, and finally to the Nag's Head, at Meriden, where they finished the day with dancing, after their accustomed fashion. The following day, being Berkswell Statute, the wedding party gratified the wondering gaze of the country people, brought together by the occasion, and were apparently not a little pleased with the attention which they everywhere received. The bridegroom's name, as it appears on the register, is Sampson Lee, and that of the bride, Elder Ifay Buckney. - <i>Coventry Mercury</i>. It appeared that on Friday the police received information that a gang of gipsies were encamped in the neighbourhood of Knebworth, and had obtained money under false pretences of Sir E. L. Bulwer Lytton's steward. Inspector Good and two constables accordingly went in pursuit, and traced the gipsies to No Man's Land, where they had encamped, their horses, five in number, quietly grazing in a farmer's turnip field. On attempting to take the party into custody, they resisted so stoutly that the police were compelled to give up the contest. Having, however, procured some volunteer assistance amongst the neighbouring farmers and labourers, the police continued in pursuit of the gang, and came up with them at Pepperstock. On examining their carts, a number of silver-mounted whips, new silk handkerchiefs, and a variety of other articles, which the police believed to have been stolen, were found. Two of the horses answered the description of horses advertised in the <i>Hue and Cry</i> . - The police asked for a remand, in order to enable them to trace the property to the owner. - The bench accordingly remanded the prisoners, but allowed one of them, Susan Lee, to go at large for the purpose of procuring evidence to show that the property rightfully belonged to her father. - Josiah Lee, one of the prisoners, was then charged with obtaining two shillings of Mrs. Webb, wife of Sir E. L. Bulwer Lytton's steward, under false pretences. - It appeared that the prisoner went to Mr. Webb's house with some powder for destroying rats, which, he said, Mr. Webb had told him to leave there. Morgan said that on the previous evening he saw the defendant driving a horse furiously up Lammas-street. When near the Plough public house he cruelly struck the horse between the ears with a large stick. The horse fell from the effects of the blows. On being interfered with by the policeman, he saucily informed him that it mattered not to him how he treated his horse. Defendant was taken into custody. He resisted, and was with difficulty conveyed to the station-house. Thomas Thomas said that he saw defendant beating his horse the previous night, with the thick end of a stick. The horse fell on his knees from the blows. Defendant was very drunk. The charge, as proved, was admitted by the defendant, who said that he was “unconsciously drunk,” and knew not what took place. He was then convicted in the penalty of 40s. and costs. <i>Sansom Lee</i> <i>[sic]</i> , brother to the last defendant, was charged with assaulting the police in the execution of their duty. P.C. Buckley deposed that between 5 and 6 o'clock on the previous night he assisted Morgan to take Elijah Lee to the Station house. Defendant came up several times and took hold of his brother and endeavoured to release him from custody. At the Station house Elijah Lee resisted, and the defendant assisted him and struck him (Buckley) on his face with a large stick. He was very drunk.
