1842	late December	Clerkenwell, MDX	died	DEATH OF AN OLD GYPSY. - Last week John Lovell, aged 80 years, expired at his residence in Fryingpan-alley, Clerkenwell. The deceased was well known in the metropolis for the last 50 years as a gypsy and travelling tinker ; and in more recent years, being afflicted with apoplexy, he lost the use of his left side, and paraded the streets in the vicinity of Lincoln's-Inn, Queen's-square, &c, calling out, "Poor old man! - pots and kettles to mend." His appearance was most deplorable, and he received sums of money from charitable persons daily, supposing him to be in great distress. After his decease a sum of money amounting to 700 <i>l</i> . was found in various parts of his room, which he had hoarded up, amongst which were several pounds' worth of farthings. On Sunday last he was respectably buried in Clerkenwell burying ground by some relatives. The deceased had a large family of children ; one of his sons was executed at the age of 17 years, at the Old Bailey, with John Henley, the captain of the celebrated West-end fair gangmen, Hampstead, for desperate highway robberies, at that fair ; two others of his sons were transported, for robberies, for their natural lives. The deceased, some years ago, resided at Paddington, and was the associate of the Lees and Coopers, gangs notorious for horse-stealing. Lee, who was at that period termed the King of the Gypsies, being convicted of horse-stealing, suffered execution. 1815	13 January	Chelmsford, ESS	at the Sessions	A gang of twelve vagabonds, consisting of three males and nine females, strolling about the country as gypsies, have been apprehended at Borley near Sudbury, Suffolk, who it seems, harbour in St. Giles's, London, some short portion of the year. The heads of this gang are Joseph and Hannah Lovel; and with them were two girls, whom they say are their daughters, called Esther and Susan; and another a niece, they call Ruth; a woman who calls herself Cinderella Boswell, a native of Staffordshire, but travels principally in Essex; and Palise the wife of Boswell's son, who belongs to a parish in Ipswich, but travels as a grinder. Joseph Lovel having about two years ago, been adjudged a rogue and vagabond, at Chelmsford, was at the sessions on the 13th ult. adjudged to be an incorrigible rogue and vagabond, and committed to the House of Correction at Chelmsford, for 6 months; the rest of the party were adjudged rogues and vagabonds, and were committed for a month. Three stout fellows belonging to the gang, effected their escape with their four asses and baggage. Two young chimney sweeps who had joined the gang, and who said their names were Henry and John Gaskin otherwise Smith, were detained on suspicion of stealing a donkey cart, in the neighbourhood of Newport, on the Cambridge Road. This was stated to the Court as a prosecution instituted by the Society for the Suppression of Vice, to endeavour to correct the scandalous practice of those Gipsies in bringing idle persons about them at Norwood, to have their fortunes told on a Sunday ; it was to correct and suppress that evil that had induced the Society to come forward to punish them, still wishing, that were there a ray of hope of amendment, the parties might be acquitted for this time. The whole were examined, and the charge of fortune-telling proved against them, but on expressing their contrition for the past, and promising never to offend again in like manner, they were liberated. Charlotte Allen, who appeared the mother and leader of the set, having six young children, was discharged on finding bail for her future good behaviour. Pentevinney Lovell did not meet so mild a sentence. The evidence against her proved that she not only told the young Gentleman's fortune to be rich, happy, and have a full enjoyment of all his wishes, but seeing him when he came up with a young Lady, she asked him the nature of their connexion ; he said she was his sweetheart ; the wily Gipsy then, in very plain terms, offered her service to tell her fortune, when she pledged herself that she would work upon her as to make her subservient to all his desires – this, it should seem, by the evidence before the Court, was the main point of their schemes, it being a general rule with abandoned libertines to ingratiate themselves with young and inexperienced femailes, whom they take on a pleasureable party to Norwood ; there they dine, and, the poor girls flushed with wine, sally forth to get their fortunes told ; the Gentleman has his fortune told first. The plan is then laid what is to be said to work upon the feelings of the poor victim, who thus, by a combination of circumstances, is plunged into inevitable ruin. This fact, melancholy as it is, has been established beyond contradiction, and is the chief reason of the Society using their utmost efforts to suppress the practice. 1838	11 June	Claines, WOR	in camp when children were arrested	On Monday night last, between nine and ten o'clock, as Mr. Green, a respectable farmer, residing at Martin Hussingtree, was proceeding towards the house of his mother in law, Mrs. Tomlinson, of Claines, where his wife was visiting, he was beset by three ruffians, most cruelly beaten, and robbed of a silver hunting watch, five half-crowns, and several shillings. One of them seized him round the neck, another held his mouth to prevent his giving the alarm, while the third rifled his pockets. In his struggling to get released they threw him into a ditch, where he was beaten in a most brutal manner. Upon his calling for assistance during the struggle, one said to his companions, "d--n him pull out the pistol, and shoot him," but this probably was done to intimidate Mr. Green, as no pistol was produced. After the robbers had left Mr. Green for a short time, he heard one of them say "d--m him, we have forgot his watch, let us go back and get it," and this they accordingly did. With much difficulty Mr. Green was enabled to reach the dwelling of his relative, which was but a little more than one hundred yards distant from the spot where he had been way laid, when he made known what had transpired, and gave a description of the persons and dress of his assailants. It being Claines Wake that day Mrs. Tomlinson had a few friends at her house spending the evening with her, and they immediately set off in pursuit of the thieves. Mrs. Tomlinson's house is situated about half a mile down a lane leading from the turnpike road, and as some gipsies had been prowling about in that vicinity, during that, and the preceding day, they hastened to some tents which had been put up lower down the lane. On arriving at them they saw an old woman, who in answer to a question from the party, informed them that there was no one inside. Not content with this they made immediate search, and found two men belonging to the gypsy tribe, both of whom feigned to be asleep, and on further search a third was found, each of them answering the description given. Mr. Green upon seeing them instantly recognized two of them as the persons who had ill-treated and robbed him. They were secured during the night, and the following morning taken before E. Sanderson, Esq., by whom they were remanded to the county gaol until Mr. Green should be able to appear against them. The prisoners stated they were brothers, and gave their names as Spencer. The oldest appears about 24, one of the others, 19, and the younger, who used the threatening language in the affray, not more than 14. Neither the watch nor any of the money was found upon them, nor has any trace of it been discovered. Mr. Green was speedily put to bed and every assistance rendered him, but we are sorry to say that he still continues to suffer very severely from the savage treatment which he received, and is unable to leave his room. During the time the robbery was being committed, and when Mr. Green reached the house of Mrs. Tomlinson, two men belonging to the same gang, and supposed to be the father and a brother of the prisoners, were being regaled with cider at her house, having played several tunes upon some musical instruments, for the amusement of Mrs. Tomlinson's guests. Three gipsies named <i>Richard</i>, <i>Uriah</i>, and <i>Spencer Lovell</i>, underwent an examination to-day at the County Gaol, before J. Sanderson, Esq. on suspicion of having been concerned in the late desperate and atrocious attack upon Mr. Green, near Claines. The prosecutor appeared to give evidence, but has not yet recovered from his severe indisposition. His face appeared much swollen and bruised in several places. 				sworn he made the following statement : - On Monday the 11th instant, I was going from my house, in Martin Hussingtree, to visit my wife at her mother-in-law's, at Tapenhall. My road lay through a lane out of the turnpike-road, and by Dean's Green. When I turned down the lane the three prisoners were standing at the corner ; it was then about a quarter past nine, and there was light sufficient for me to see their faces. I went on down the lane and they followed. When about 300 yards from the end of the lane Spencer Lovell jumped upon my back, and his brothers closed upon me ; and while one placed his hands over my mouth to prevent my giving any alarm, the other struck me in the face. They all three dragged me to the ditch, rifled my pockets of all the silver they contained, and took my watch, pocket-book, umbrella, and hat. At this time Richard Lovell had hold of my head, and said to me "d--n you, if you don't be quiet I'll shoot you." I cried out "Murder!" and then Uriah threatened in a like manner. They continued striking me until I was senseless. On recovering I saw them going up the lane again, and I exerted myself to reach the house of Mrs. Tomlinson ; when I got there my face was streaming with blood. The youngest of the prisoners was begging at my house a week or two ago, and I gave him some cider. From this circumstance I can swear that he was one of the party ; I recognized him immediately. His brothers are the other two. - Francis Davis, butcher, sworn : I was at Mrs. Tomlinson's house on the night in question. Hearing some person say "here's a man nearly killed," I went into the yard and found the prosecutor with his head and face profusely bleeding. On his saying he had been attacked and robbed by three gipsies in the lane, I went out with Thomas Boucher to endeavour to apprehend them. We went to some tents near the spot where some gipsies had been encamped, and I asked the women if there were any men inside. They replied no, they were all at Worcester ; but not being satisfied with this answer I went in the first tent and found the prisoner Richard, and in the second one, Uriah. Boucher took hold of the former, and I the latter. We took them to Mr. Green, who was then lying in bed ; he identified them both, and said there was a younger one that we had not found. We in consequence returned to the tents and found the two women lying on the prisoner Spencer Lovell, whom we took into custody. I gave him into the custody of Taylor the constable. - Thomas Boucher, farming bailiff, corroborated the statement of this witness, and added that the hat of the prosecutor, his pocket-book, and umbrella, were found in the lane a few days after the robbery ; but the watch and the money have not been recovered. After a patient investigation of the case, which lasted nearly three hours, the prisoners were fully committed to take their trial at the ensuing Assizes.

Hughes, Esq., county coroner, held an inquest at the Westminster Arms Hotel, on the body of Jane Bury, alias Jane Lovell, who for the last seven years had been a member of the well-known gipsy tribe of Lovell. The circumstances attending the decease were deemed, by persons living in the neighbourhood, sufficient to warrant an enquiry, and accordingly notice was sent to the coroner. Although not given as evidence, it appeared that deceased, who was only 26 years of age, was the daughter of a gamekeeper in Dorsetshire, and that about seven or eight years ago she was induced to leave her home and assume the vagrant life of a gipsy, and in a short time she became the partner of Zachariah Lovell, an old man, with blear eyes [sic], and a nose and chin displaying a tendency to approximate, who is believed to have long passed the term generally allotted to man. She continued with him till her death on Sunday last, the circumstances attending which will be found fully detailed in the evidence given below. Zachariah Lovell: I have no settled habitation, but travel about the country. I am about 70 years of age. The deceased lived with me as my wife, and had done so for seven years. We had one child, a girl now about four years old. About a month ago we came into the neighbourhood of Mathon. The remainder of the tribe joined us on Wednesday last. We all lived in tents by the road side. The deceased has been an invalid for some time past. I was told by doctors at several places we called at that she was in a decline, and that they could do no good for her. We encamped in the road near the Westminster Arms on the 6th August. Deceased continued to get worse, but I did not get any more advice. She expressed a wish to go to the workhouse at last, as she said to "have a	The Worcestershire Chronicle, 23 August 1854, 4

				good bed." I was willing for her to go, but took no steps to get her there. She did not want for food at any time. Sarah Lovell, wife of Thomas Lovell, and sister of the former witness said I have known the deceased for the past seven years. We have occasionally lived together, but not in any settled place, except in the winter season. I joined Zachariah a week ago. Deceased was very unwell, and my party had left them a week previous, and joined again for "company's sake," when I found her a great deal worse. A doctor at Witley said she was in a consumption. She said she wanted to go to the workhouse. I and my son went to the overseer on Sunday last. As soon as we applied to him he came with a horse and cart, and put her into the cart. She died, I believe, in the cart. We did not apply to the parish authorities before Sunday. Elizabeth Price, wife of Joseph Price, a mason, said : The gipsies were encamped just below our garden, and I saw the deceased frequently during the last fortnight. She was in a very bad state when she came, and in my opinion ought not to have been removed from their last location. A gentleman from Malvern tried to get deceased a letter of admission to the Infirmary, but could not succeed. He, however, gave her some clothes for her child, and also some money. Mr. E. W. Greenfield: I saw the deceased late on Saturday night. I saw that she was in a dying state, and used my best endeavours to get her removed to the Ledbury union. Edward Rutter, overseer of the parish of Mathon: It was about 10 o'clock on Sunday morning last that I first heard of the dangerous state in which the deceased was. Two of the Lovells came and asked me to have her removed to the workhouse. I went to Mr. Vale, the magistrate, and he directed me to have her removed at once. I got a spring cart, put her into it, and sent her in charge on the journey to Ledbury, but before they got half a mile she died. It did not occur to me to apply to a medical man before removing her, although she was dying. Edmund Wadams, Esq., surgeon, of Malvern had made a <i>post mortem</i> examination of the body, and found much tubercular disease of the lungs, the right lung quite gone, and the left nearly so. The stomach was perfectly healthy and contained food. The body was not much emaciated. There was no appearance of want. I have no doubt her mode of life in a great measure brought on the disease which ultimately caused death. She died a natural death, but there can be no doubt that it was accelerated by exposure to cold and damp. On Sunday Sen'night they came to church, the mother to return thanks, and the others to stand sponsors for the young gipsy. Their behaviour at church was very becoming ; and they made the responses loud, particularly the Lord's prayer. They promised Mr. Jones that they would always come to church, when in the neighbourhood ; which promise they have hitherto kept, having been already three times to hear him. He visited them in their tents, for which they appeared very thankful. It was but a few days previous to his execution that any due impression of religion could be made upon him, and he at length not only confessed the justice of his sentence, but avowed that he had been guilty of every crime short of murder. After this he evinced great contrition, and continually cried for mercy. Cassidy and Henley were more early in their acknowledgments of guilt and in exhibiting a sincere repentance. Henley slept the whole of the night and at six o'clock yesterday morning complained much of hunger, and ate a hearty breakfast. Fonsick, the old man for forgery, and Cassidy, being Roman Catholics, were attended by the Rev. Mr. DEVEREAUX ; Henley and Lovell by the Rev. Mr. COTTON and some religious friends. They all received the Sacrament at an early hour, and the Sheriffs having arrived soon after seven o'clock, the fatal preparations were made, and the unfortunate men were led to the scaffold. On their way thence they prayed devoutly, and to the latest moment manifested the deepest repentance and resignation. The youthful appearance of Lovell excited a simultaneous burst of feeling from the crowd, under the impression that he was much younger than we have stated.
